

Regional Climate Summary

June 2023

- June was **HOT** and **DRY** for much of West Texas and southeast New Mexico with **11** different record highs and warm lows set during the latter half of the month at Midland Intl.
- A record streak of consecutive days reaching **100°F** or more was set at **15** days between June 15th and June 29th at Midland Intl.
- Rio Grande Village set a new all time high of **119°F** on June 24th, which is one degree short of the all time Texas state record of **120°F**
- June 2nd saw multiple rounds of severe weather with four confirmed tornadoes across Pecos and Terrell counties, three rated EF-Unknown and one rated EF-One.
- Large hail and severe winds were seen across portions of southeast New Mexico and West Texas on June 7th.

Midland Int'l Airport June Statistics:

- Warmest Day: 111°F on the 21st, 25th, and 26th
- Coldest Night: 59°F on the 4th and 6th
- Average Temperature: 84.8°F (Normal: 82.6°F)
- Precipitation Total: 0.06" (Normal: 1.80")
- Snowfall Total: 0"
- Highest Wind Gust: 54 mph on the 7th
