




**OVERVIEW: Scattered thunderstorms will be followed by areas of heavy rainfall Monday afternoon through Tuesday associated with Tropical Storm Isaias. Rainfall of 2 to 5 inches with isolated higher amounts will lead to potentially life threatening flash and urban flooding along with possible minor to moderate river flooding.**

<b>Affected Rivers</b>	In Virginia/West Virginia/Maryland: James, Rappahannock, Shenandoah, Middle and Lower Potomac In New Jersey/Pennsylvania: Passaic, Raritan, Schuylkill, and Southeast Pennsylvania tributaries
<b>Timing</b>	Highest risk for river flooding: Tuesday and Wednesday.
<b>Hazards &amp; Impacts</b>	Minor to Moderate river flooding possible. Minor flooding means flooding of some roads and low lying areas near buildings. Moderate flooding means roads flooded along with flooding of some homes and/or other structures.
<b>Confidence</b>	Medium confidence that some river locations will see minor flooding. Because of rainfall forecast uncertainty, confidence in moderate flooding is somewhat lower.
<b>Additional Information</b>	Potential also exists for life threatening flash, coastal, and urban flooding from Monday afternoon through Wednesday. Fast flowing water is extremely dangerous. Most flood deaths occur in vehicles. <b>Turn Around, Don't Drown.</b>
