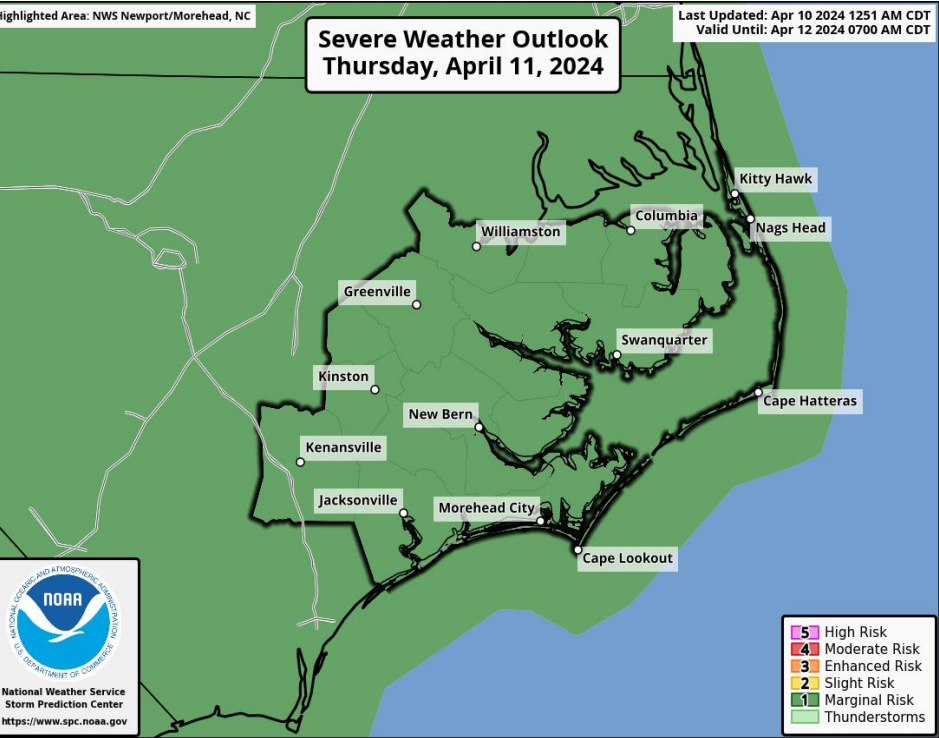


Severe Weather, Gusty Winds and Coastal Impacts



OVERVIEW

A strong frontal system will impact eastern NC Thursday and Thursday night, bringing the potential for isolated strong to severe thunderstorms, gusty winds, and coastal impacts.



HAZARDS & IMPACTS

- Isolated thunderstorms capable of producing damaging wind gusts and a brief tornado will be possible.
- Winds – Southerly wind gusts 30-40 mph

- Thursday afternoon and evening

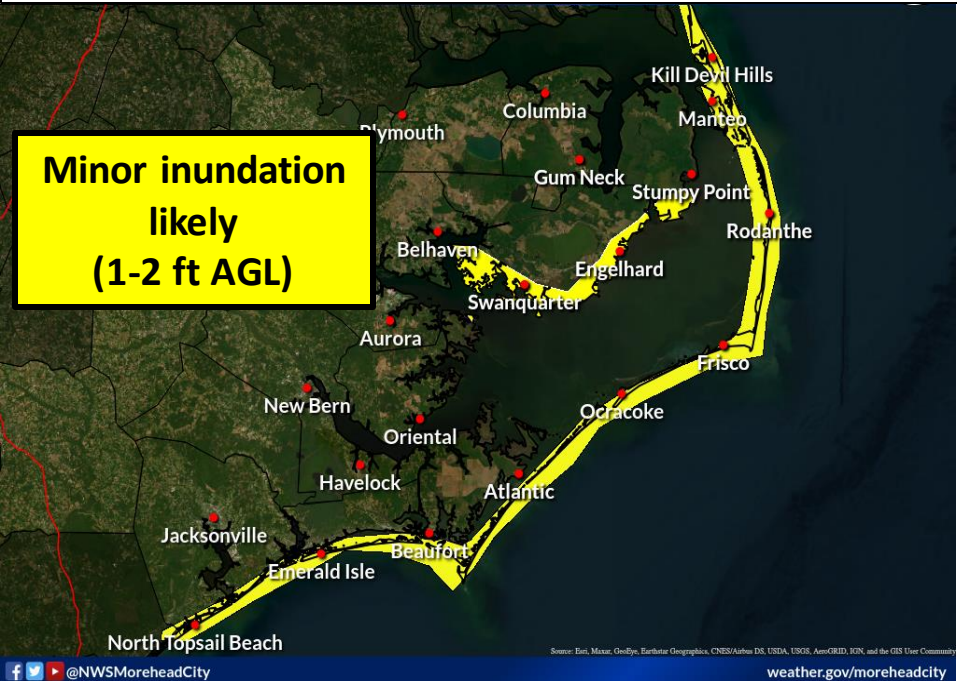

Coastal Flooding Likely Thursday Afternoon into Friday



OVERVIEW

King Tides may keep water levels elevated through tonight which could result in minor nuisance coastal flooding. **Better chances for minor coastal flooding expected Thursday afternoon into Friday.**



HAZARDS & IMPACTS

- **Coastal Flood and High Surf Advisories have been issued.**
- **Minor inundation (1-2 ft AGL)** likely Thursday afternoon into Friday.
Oceanside – Greatest threat from Oregon Inlet to North Topsail Beach. Including Ocracoke Island (which could impact travel on NC-12 and ferry services).
Soundside – Areas adjacent to the northern Pamlico Sound, the Pungo River, as well as the Outer Banks from Duck to Avon. Roanoke Island may see some localized minor flooding Friday night into Saturday morning when the westerly winds will be strongest.
- In addition: rough surf, localized beach erosion and an elevated rip current risk expected.
- Dangerous marine conditions expected. Gale Watches have been issued for the coastal waters, Pamlico, Croatan and Roanoke Sounds.
