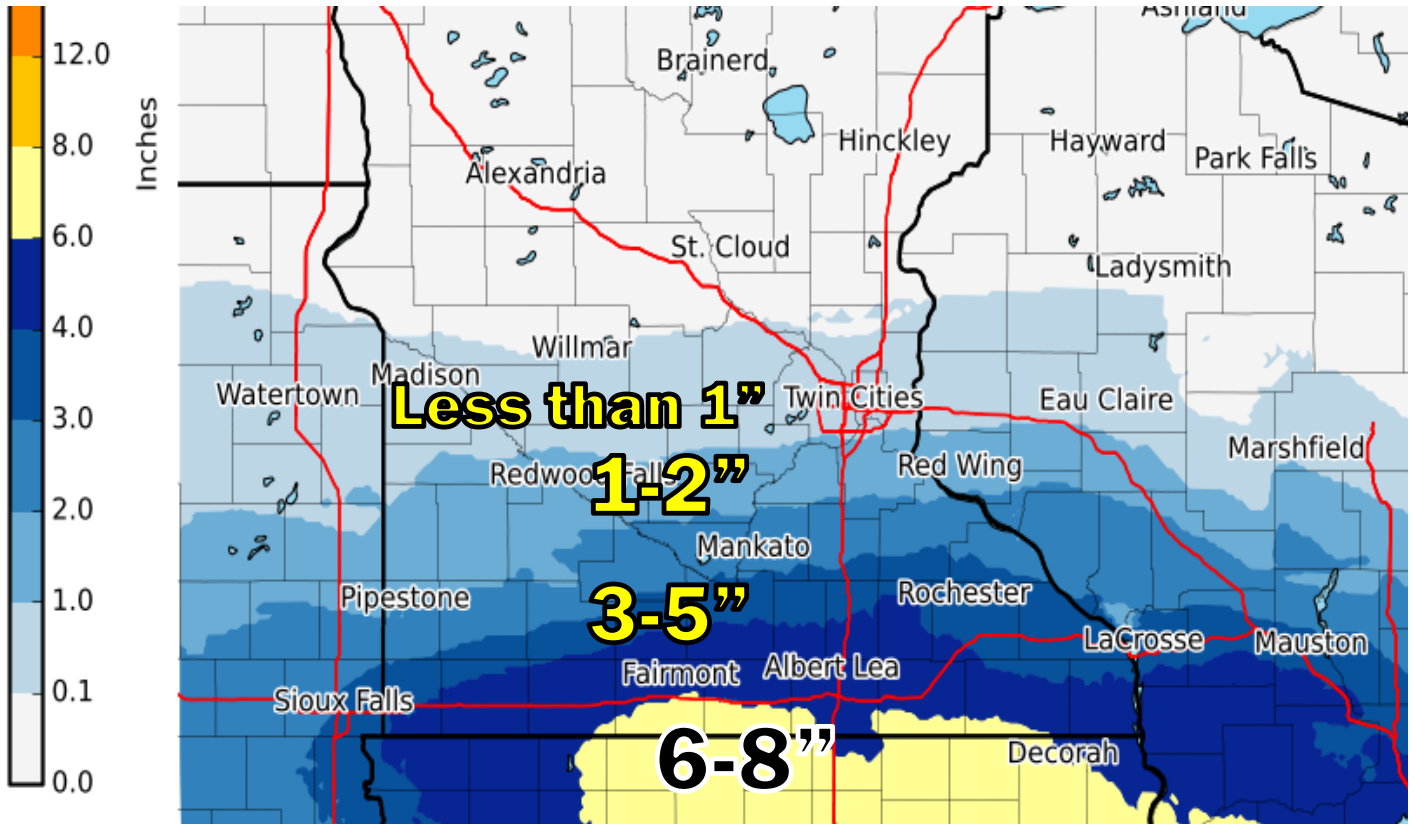




## Accumulating Snow Today into This Evening



### Message of the Day:

- Accumulating snow expected today into this evening
- Heaviest snow (6-8") expected across far south central MN near and south of the I-90 corridor
- Winter storm warning in effect for far southern MN
- Winter weather advisory bordering warning far southern MN

### Important Forecast Changes

- Amounts have been reduced slightly as storm track has shifted south a bit .
- Removed northernmost tier of Advisory and trimmed the warning





## Accumulating Snow Late Tonight thru Wed

### Key Points



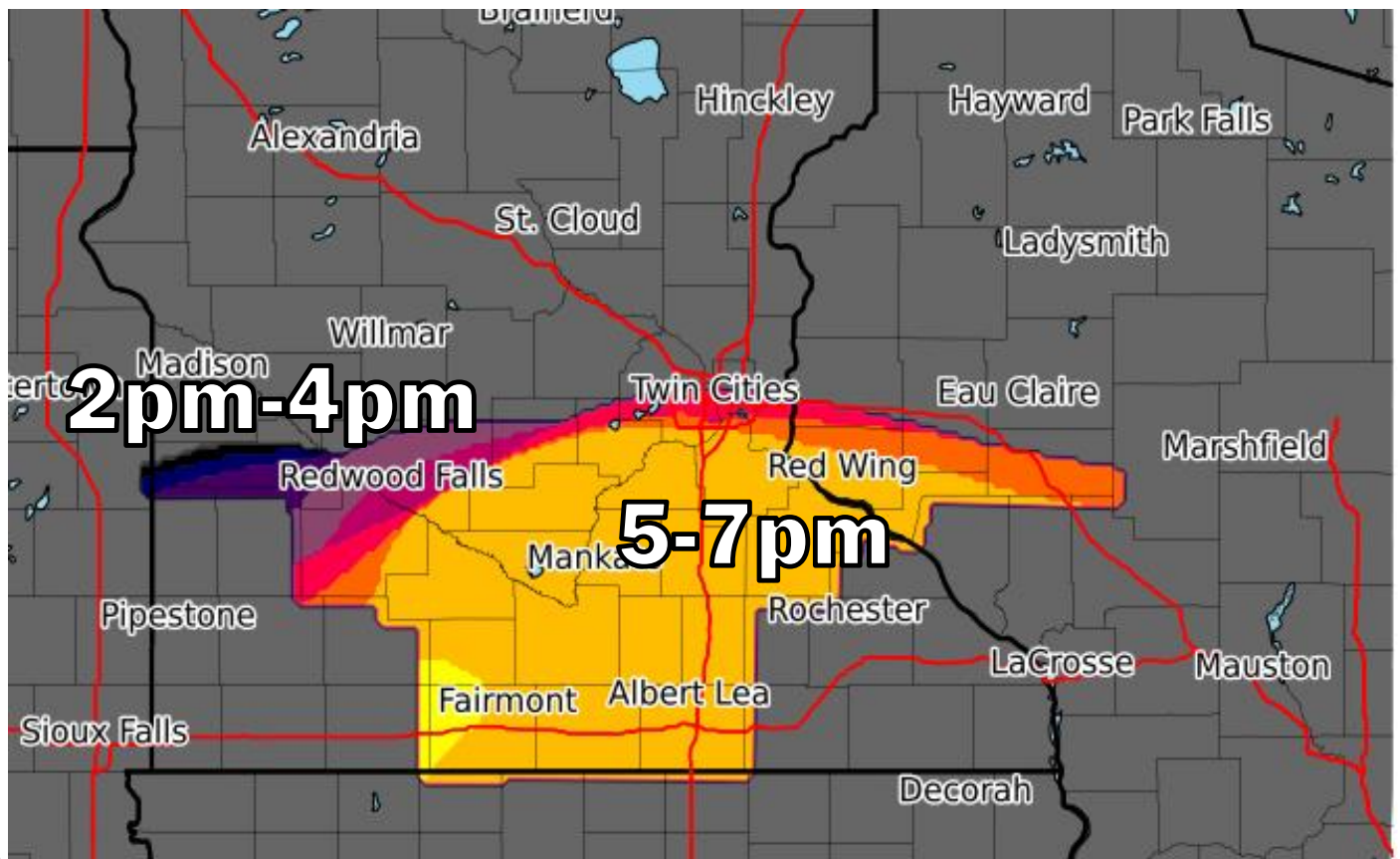
**Hazards:** Travel may be hazardous today into this evening



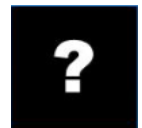
**Areas Impacted:** Mainly southern Minnesota, south of a line from Redwood Falls to Red Wing. Lesser impacts north of that line and for western WI



**Timing & Duration:** Snow will spread across southern MN this morning. See the image below for estimated end time of snow. diminish Wednesday evening



**Impacts:** Main impact will slick roadways from accumulating snow. Little blowing and drifting of snow expected



**Certainty & Considerations:** Medium confidence in forecast amounts. Higher confidence in timing.

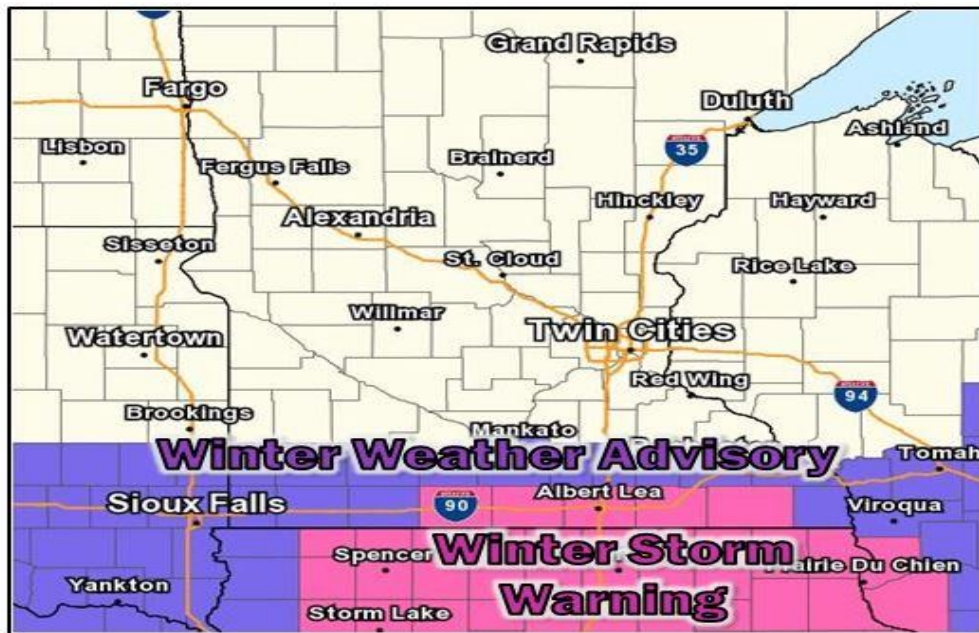


## Accumulating Snow Late Tonight thru Wed

### Message of the Day:

- Travel impacts to spread across southern third of MN today
- Heaviest snow (6-8") expected across far south central MN along and south of I-90 corridor. Some snowfall rates near 1" per hour 10am-3pm.
- Minimal blowing snow and impacts.

### Today into This Evening



#### Preparedness:

- A **Winter Storm Warning** is issued when a combination of heavy snow, blowing snow, and possibly ice mixed with snow is expected to impact the area. *Time to act!*
