Subject: National Tsunami Warning Center Routine Communications Tests for  
the West Coast and Alaska Coast to Take Place on July 24, 2025

The NWS National Tsunami Warning Center (NTWC) and coastal NWS Weather  
Forecast Offices (WFOs) will perform a routine monthly tsunami  
communication test to ensure end-to-end readiness of NWS dissemination  
software and hardware on Thursday, July 24, 2025.

The intended recipients of these communication tests include designated  
national focal points, state/territorial warning points, coastal WFOs,  
U.S. Coast Guard and critical military dissemination points.

Valid Time Event Code (VTEC) for the test messages will start with the /T  
fixed identifier (versus /O for operational messages). To provide  
additional assurance that a test message is not inadvertently distributed  
as an actual Warning/Advisory/Watch product, the Event Tracking Numbers  
(ETNs) for the test messages will begin with 9 as the leading digit of  
the four character code.

The text products affected by routine monthly tsunami communication  
testing are the national tsunami products issued under the following  
Advanced Weather Interactive Processing System (AWIPS) Product  
Identifiers (PIL) and World Meteorological Organization (WMO) Identifiers  
(IDs):
