Subject: Changes to Alaska Aviation Weather Unit Surface and Significant Weather charts starting on or after February 22, 2026

The Alaska Aviation Weather Unit (AAWU) will implement changes to its Surface and Significant Weather charts starting on February 22, 2026. For the Surface chart, this change will result in improved quality, resolution, additional probabilistic precipitation information, and improved consistency with other NWS products.

AAWU Significant Weather charts will continue to provide much of the same information as previously, with the only change being with the removal of frontal information. For users requiring forecast frontal information, this can still be obtained through Ocean Prediction Center Alaska/Arctic Analysis and Graphical Forecasts at [https://ocean.weather.gov/AK\\_tab.php](https://ocean.weather.gov/AK_tab.php). These graphics will also continue to be linked on the AAWU's website.

The new Surface and Significant Weather charts are intended to provide better readability to users, while utilizing higher resolution, adding probabilistic information, and improving consistency with other NWS products. Additionally the production of these charts will move from a beyond end of life system to a more sustainable system for the future.
