Subject: Soliciting Comments until October 31, 2014 on Discontinuing the
Coded Marine Verification Forecast (MVF)

Effective immediately and continuing through October 31, 2014, the NWS is seeking comments on its proposal to discontinue the Coded Marine Verification Forecast (MVF).

The MVF is a legacy system product containing coded wind, wave, and hazard forecasts for sensors on fixed-point locations for specific time periods. The product's main use was measuring marine forecast performance.

The new marine forecast verification system takes all NWS marine wind and wave forecasts directly from the National Digital Forecast Database (NDFD). NWS no longer needs to issue a coded forecast for fixed-point locations to measure performance and thus no longer uses the MVF.
