Subject: Soliciting comments on Experimental Hurricane Threats
and Impacts Web Interface through November 30, 2015

Effective August 17, 2015 and continuing through November 30,
2015, the NWS is seeking user feedback on an experimental
Hurricane Threats and Impacts Web Interface (HTI-Web).

The experimental HTI-Web is an internet-based decision-support
service designed to help users quickly interface with local
hazard information whenever tropical storm or hurricane watches
and/or warnings are in effect along the United States East and
Gulf coasts, including Puerto Rico. Local threat assessments
and corresponding potential impacts information about tropical
storm or hurricane wind, storm surge, flooding rain, and
tornadoes are provided by coastal Weather Forecast Offices
(WFOs).

The webpage is based upon official tropical storm and hurricane
forecast and warning products provided by WFOs and NWS' National
Centers.

Updates will be provided at least every six hours, and will
cease when watches and/or warnings are no longer in effect.
