

Important Note

We are currently [surveying](#) separately on a proposal to transition “Small Craft Advisory” to “Small Craft Warning”. Also, we are still developing specific proposals to transition El Nino/La Nina Advisory, High Surf Advisory, and Tsunami Advisory to plain language headlines.
