A sharp Arctic cold front combined with an upper level disturbance to produce a combination of dangerously cold wind chill values and snow and blowing snow. Wind chill values dropped to 20 below to 25 below zero as visibilities occasionally fell to 1/4 mile or less. Although total snowfall was mainly just an inch or two, the poor visibilities and locally slick conditions caused several multi-car accidents or multiple cases of cars reported in ditches. Northwest winds sustained at 25 to 30 mph with gusts to 40 or 45 mph prevailed behind the front and temperatures fell into the lower to mid single digits. This was just one day after readings climbed to around 40 degrees.
