OVERVIEW

- An Arctic airmass will affect the region Monday into Wednesday.

HAZARDS & IMPACTS

- **Frigid Temperatures:**
 - Lows in the single digits/lower teens Mon Night and Tue Night.
 - Highs only in the teens to near 20 deg F on Tue.
 - Temperatures will likely be 20 deg F or lower Monday Night through Wednesday morning.
 - **Impacts** - Threat for poorly insulated water pipes to freeze and burst.
- **Sub Zero Wind Chills Monday Night into Tuesday:**
 - Wind chills as low as 0 to 10 degrees below zero Mon Night into Tue Morning.
 - **Impacts**- Hypothermia and frostbite with prolonged exposure.

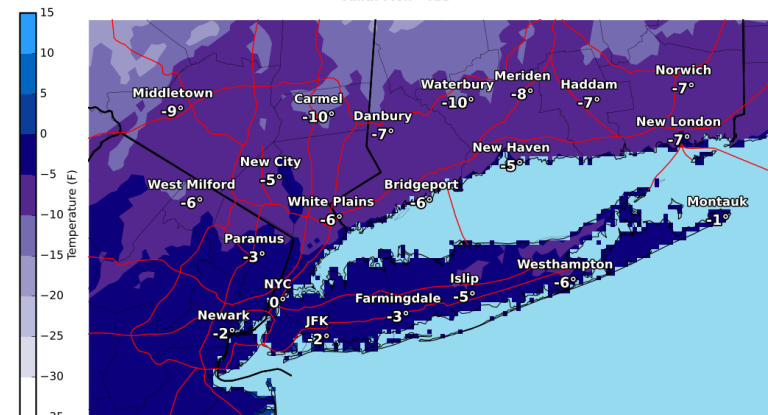

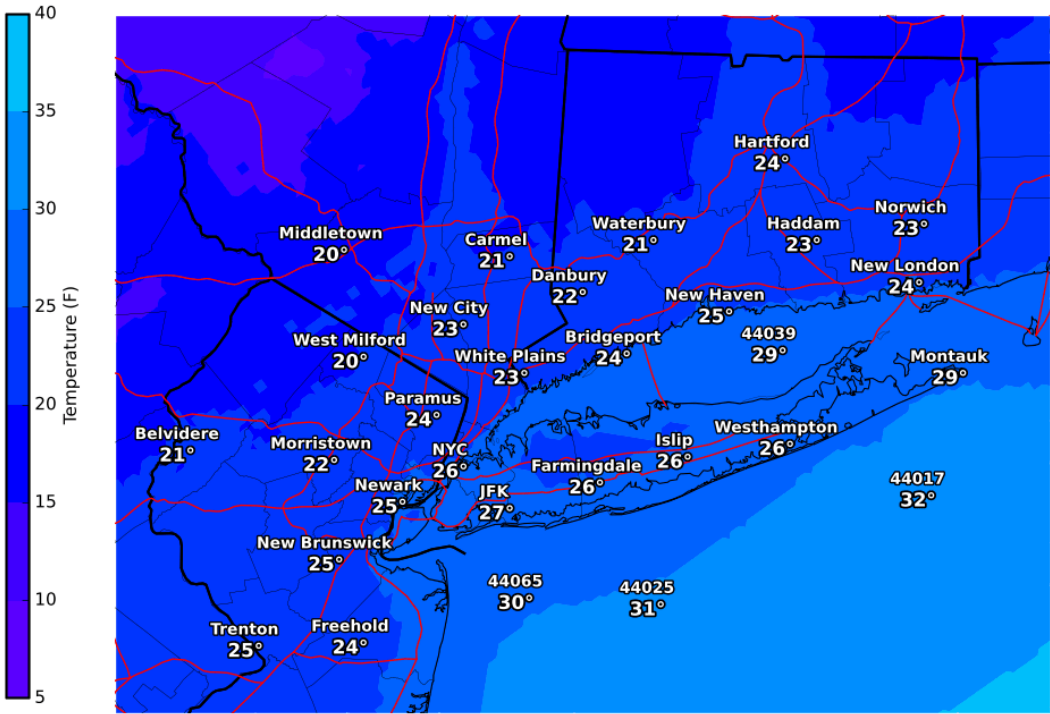
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Minimum Temperature Forecast Tonight into Monday AM

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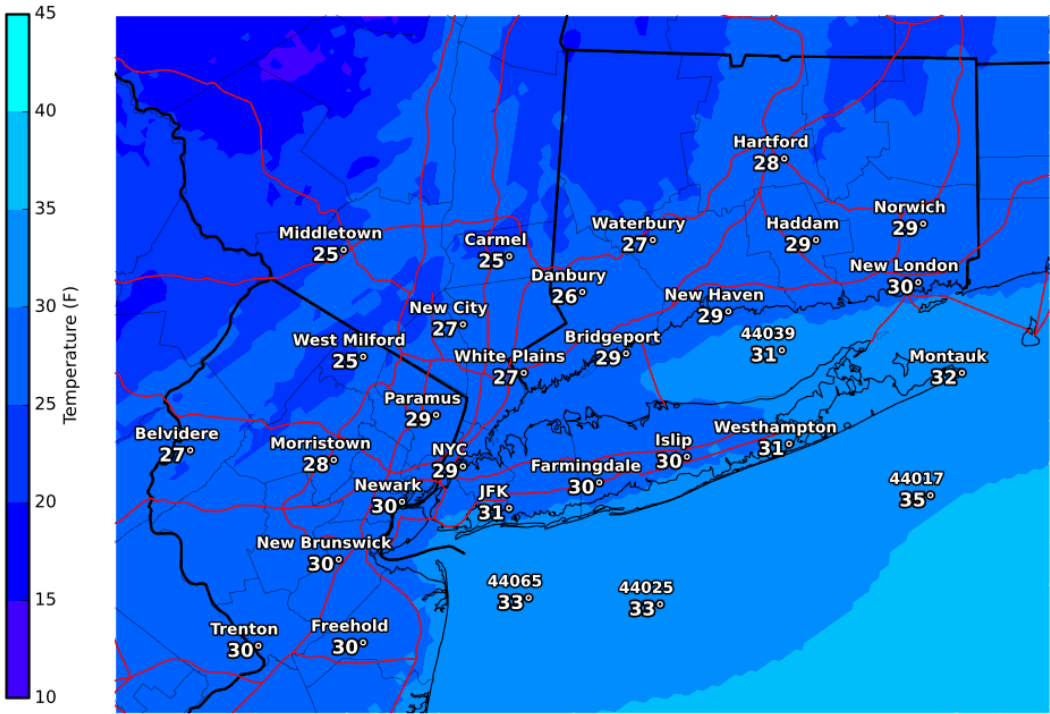
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Maximum Temperature Forecast Monday

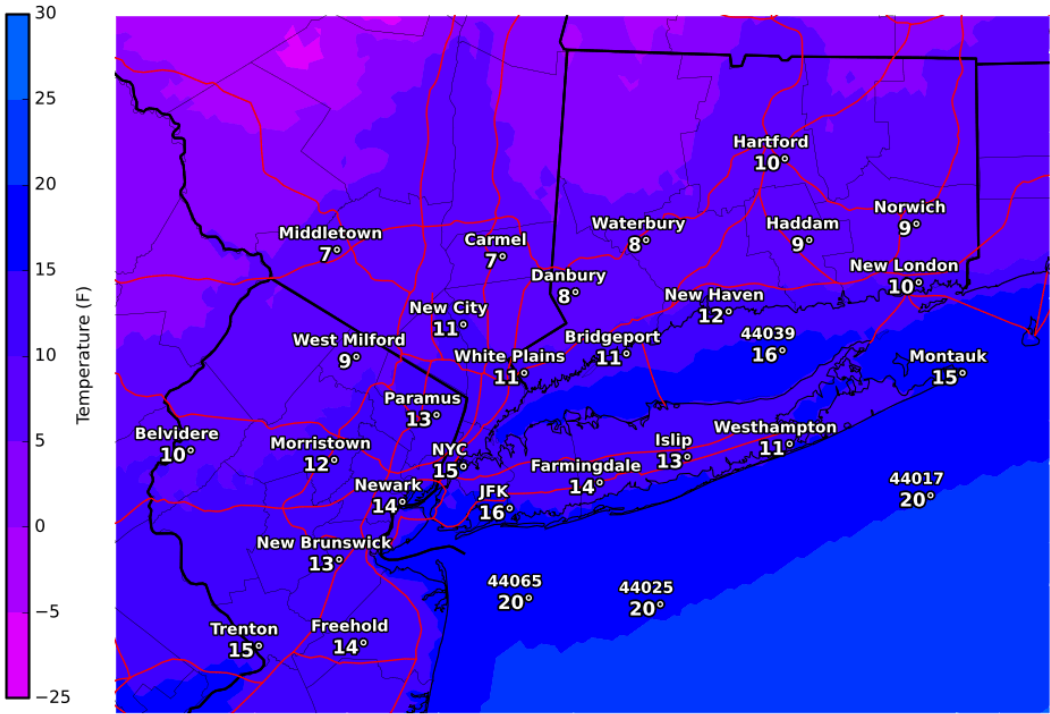
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Minimum Temperature Forecast Mon Night into Tue AM

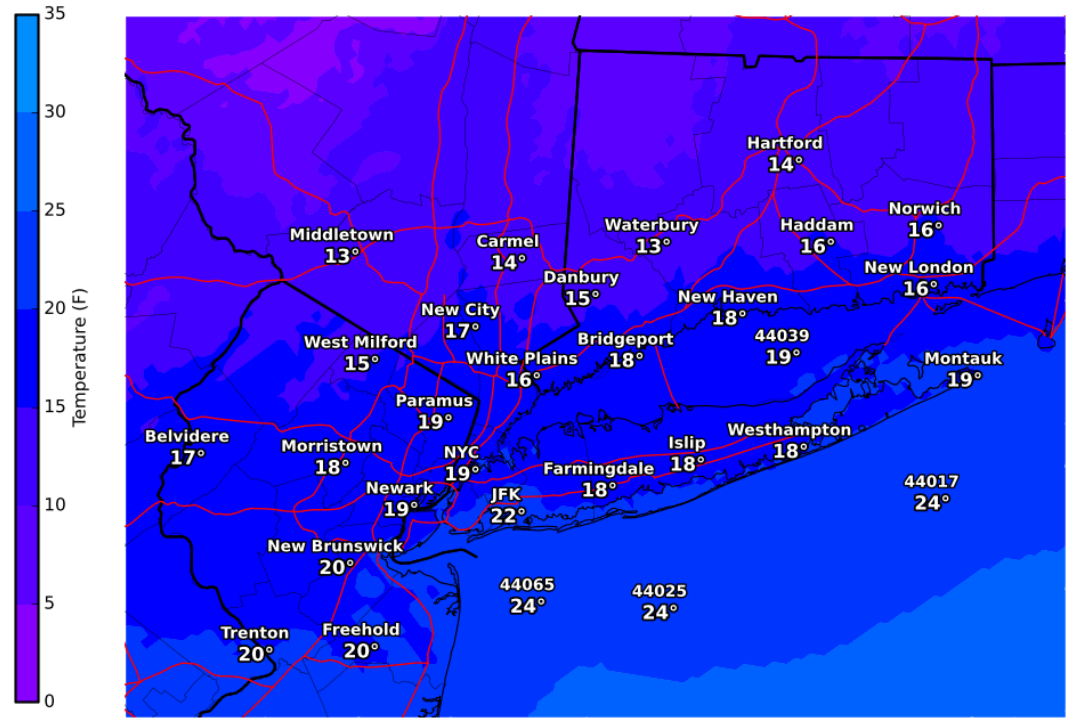
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Maximum Temperature Forecast Tuesday

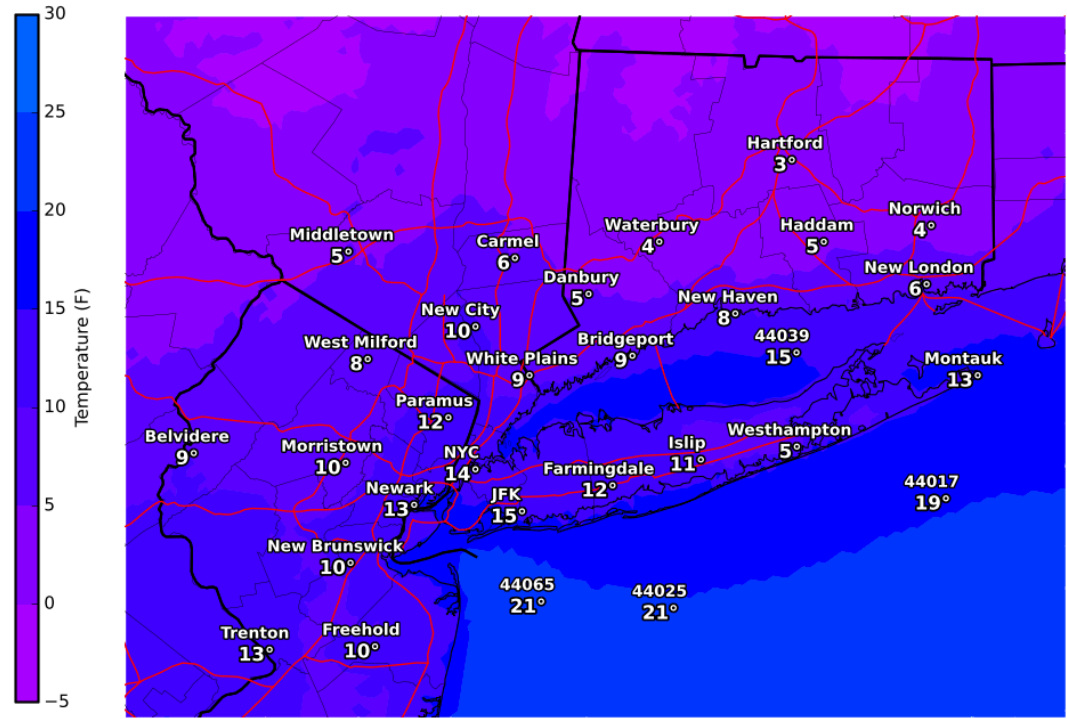

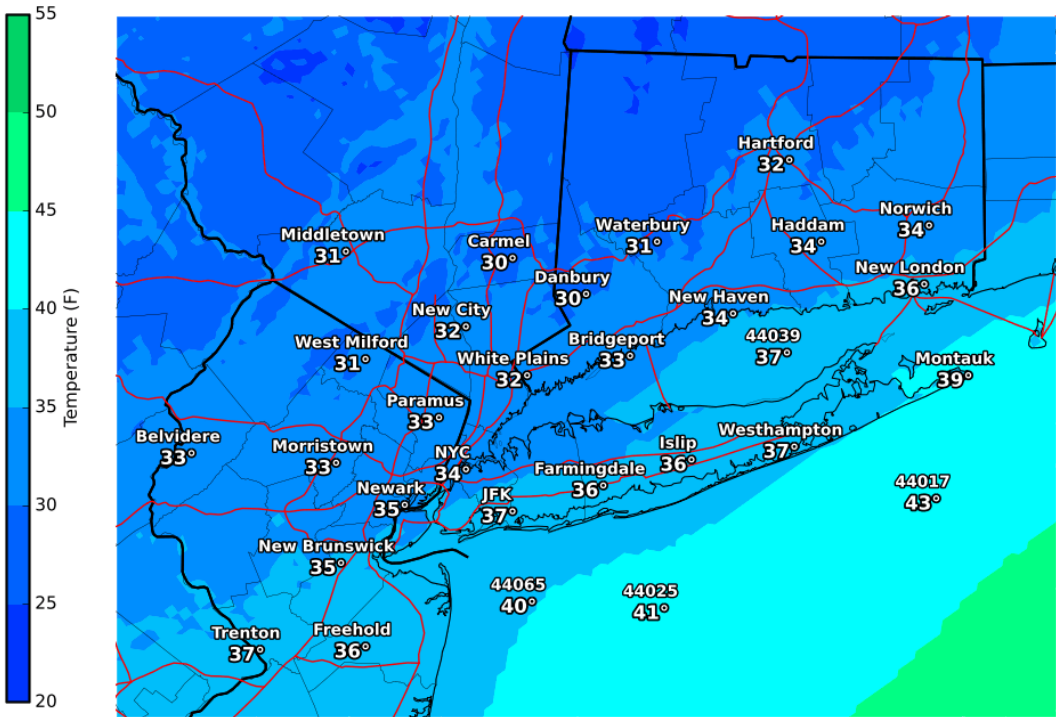
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Maximum Temperature Forecast Wednesday

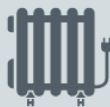


Heating Fire Safety



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Follow these heating tips to help maintain a fire-safe home this winter.



Space Heater

- Keep anything that can burn, such as bedding, clothing and curtains, at least 3 feet away from the heater.
- Make sure the heater has an automatic shut-off, so if it tips over, it shuts off.
- Turn heaters off when you go to bed or leave the room.
- Plug portable heaters directly into outlets and never into an extension cord or power strip.
- Only use portable heaters from a recognized testing laboratory.



Fireplace

- Keep a glass or metal screen in front of the fireplace to prevent embers or sparks jumping out.
- Do not burn paper in your fireplace.
- Put the fire out before you go to sleep or leave your home.
- Put ashes in a metal container with a lid, outside, at least 10 feet from your home.



Wood Stove

- Make sure your wood stove is 3 feet from anything that can burn.
- Do not burn paper in your wood stove.
- Put the fire out before you go to sleep or leave your home.
- Have your chimney inspected and cleaned each year by a professional.



Furnace

- Have your furnace inspected each year.
- Keep anything that can burn away from the furnace.



Kerosene Heater

- Only use kerosene heaters from a recognized testing laboratory.
- Make sure the heater has an automatic shut-off, so if it tips over, it shuts off.
- Refuel your cooled heater outside.
