



Strong Winter Storm Fri Night thru Sat

Briefing Number 4


Overview -

Confidence is increasing for a strong storm system to bring moderate to heavy snowfall and strong winds to much of the area Friday night through Saturday.

What's Changed?

Winter Storm Watch expanded to include most of NE NJ and Lower Hudson valley for Fri Night thru Sat.

Storm Watch issued for the ocean waters for Saturday.

Forecast Challenges:

Confidence is increasing in forecast snowfall amounts, but there is still uncertainty on the western extent and duration of moderate and heavy snow banding late Friday Night into Saturday. This will be refined over the next 36 hrs.

Hazards and Impacts:

Long Island and SE CT

- ✓ Snow Accum: 10-15"
- Snowfall Rates: 1-2"/hr possible
- ✓ Snow Character: Powdery snow
- ✓ Temps: Dropping into lower 20s Fri Night and holding thru Sat. Lower teens Sat Night.
- ✓ Impacts: Dangerous Travel, Blizzard conditions possible

NYC, NE NJ, SW CT, much of Lower Hud

- **✓ Snow Accum:** 5-10"
- ✓ Snowfall Rates: Up to 1"/hr possible
- ✓ Snow Character: Powdery snow
- Temps: Dropping into teens to around 20 Fri Night and holding thru Sat. Around 10 F Sat Night.
- Impacts: Difficult Travel, Blowing snow

Orange and W Passaic County

- ✓ Snow Accum: 2-5"
- ✓ Snow Character: Powdery snow
- ✓ Temps: Dropping into lower to mid teens Fri Night and holding thru Sat. Single digits Sat Night.
- √ Impacts: Hazardous Travel, Blowing snow

Timing:

Snow developing Friday evening. Heaviest snow from Late Friday Night through Saturday Aft/Eve. Snow ending late Sat aft/eve.












Official NWS NY Snowfall Forecast












Probabilistic Snowfall Forecast Scenarios



Snow amounts could be close to these levels in spots if the storm continues to tend west and/or heavy snow banding develops/persists over the area.

Snow amounts could be this low if the eastern most storm scenarios occur. The potential for this is decreasing.

Strong Wind Potential



Forecast Challenges:

Confidence is increasing in the forecast winds, but wind/gust speeds could increase or decrease by 5 mph or so based on storm track and intensity.

Hazards and Impacts:

Eastern LI and Southeastern CT

- √ Peak Winds: N 25-35g 50-55mph
- ✓ Impacts: Scattered downed tree limbs and power lines. Few downed trees. Power outages possible. Dangerous travel with Blizzard conditions possible.

NYC/NJ metro, SW CT, S Westchester

- ✓ Peak Winds: N 20-30 g 35-45 mph
- Impacts: Difficult travel with blowing and drifting snow.

Interior portions of NE NJ, Lower Hud, and SW CT

- ✓ Peak Winds: N 15-20 g 25-35 mph
- Impacts: Hazardous travel with blowing snow

Timing:

✓ Strongest winds from Saturday morning into Saturday Evening











Coastal Flooding

Coastal Flood Hazards and Impacts:

- ✓ Minor to locally moderate coastal flood impacts possible (flooding of 1 to locally 2 ft above ground), for the vulnerable twin forks, north shore of LI and north shore of barrier island shoreline communities for the Saturday AM/PM and Sunday AM high tides.
- ✓ Impacts: Several waterfront road closures possible and flooding of shoreline properties. Minor damage to shoreline structures possible.
- ✓ Elsewhere generally localized minor coastal impacts expected Sat AM/PM high tide, with more widespread minor flooding possible for south shore bay communities Sunday AM

Shoreline Hazards and Impacts:

- √ 4-8' breaking waves along the oceanfront with scattered areas of dune erosion. Overwashes are not likely.
- ✓ Minor to moderate erosion and wave splashover along the north shore of Long Island and twin forks from 3 to 5 ft surf during Sat AM through Sun AM high tides.

Timing:

✓ During times of high tide Saturday morning, Saturday evening, and Sunday morning

Forecast Challenges:

✓ The magnitude of coastal flooding will depend on the track, strength and speed of low pressure, which will need to be refined over the next 36 hrs. The most widespread minor coastal impacts may be with Sunday morning high tide.

Many coastal communities will experience damagewith some shoreline and flood prone homes and businesses being destroyed. Many cars will likely be submerged or washed away. Several sections of nearshore roads and escape routes will be impassable and a few could be washed out. Flood waters may extend well inland in low lying areas. |









Event Summary

- 10 15" of snow likely and strong winds across LI and SE CT Friday Night into Saturday Evening. Dangerous travel and blizzard conditions possible.
- ✓ 5 10" of snow and strong winds likely across NYC, NE NJ, SW CT and much of Lower Hudson Valley Friday Night into Saturday Afternoon. Difficult travel and blowing snow possible.
- ✓ Minor to locally moderate coastal impacts are possible for the vulnerable twin forks, north shore of LI and north shore of barrier island shoreline communities for the Saturday AM/PM and Sunday AM high tides. Minor flooding may become more widespread Sun AM high tides.
