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Moderate to Heavy Snow – Blizzard Conditons



Forecast Challenges:

Confidence is increasing in forecast snowfall amounts, but there is inherent uncertainty on the western extent and duration of moderate and heavy snow banding late tonight into Saturday. This will be refined as the event unfolds tonight into Saturday.

Hazards and Impacts:

Eastern LI and Southeastern CT – Blizzard Warning

- ✓ Snow Accum: 12-18", locally 2 ft possible.
- ✓ Snowfall Rates: 1-3"/hr possible
- Snow Character: Powdery snow
- ✓ Temps: Dropping into teens tonight and holding thru Sat. Around 10 F Sat Night / Windchills -5 to -10F
- ✓ Impacts: Dangerous Travel, Blizzard conditions

NYC, NE NJ, SW CT, W LI, Lower Hud – Winter Storm Warning

- ✓ Snow Accum: 6-12"
- Snowfall Rates: 1"/hr possible
- Snow Character: Powdery snow
- Temps: Dropping into teens tonight and holding thru Sat. Single digits to lower teens Sat Night / Windchills 0 to -14 F
- Impacts: Difficult Travel, near blizzard conditions

Orange County

- ✓ Snow Accum: 2-5"
- Snow Character: Powdery snow
- ✓ Temps: Dropping into lower to mid teens tonight and holding thru Sat. Single digits Sat Night / Windchills -10 to -15F
- Impacts: Hazardous Travel, Blowing snow

Timing:

✓ Snow developing tonight. Heaviest snow from tonight through Saturday Aft/Eve. Snow ending late Sat aft/eve.









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Official NWS NY Snowfall Forecast












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Probabilistic Snowfall Forecast Scenarios



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Strong to Damaging Wind Potential

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Hazards and Impacts:

Eastern LI and Southeastern CT

- ✓ Damaging Winds: N 25-40g50-60mph
- Impacts: Numerous downed tree limbs and scattered downed trees. Power outages likely.
 Dangerous to impossible travel with blizzard conditions.

NYC/NJ metro, SW CT, S Westchester, W LI

- Strong Winds: N 20-35 g 40-50 mph
- Impacts: Scattered downed tree limbs.
 Power outages possible. Difficult travel with near blizzard conditions.

Interior portions of NE NJ, Lower Hud, and SW CT

- ✓ Peak Winds: N 15-20 g 25-35 mph
- Impacts: Hazardous travel with blowing snow

Timing:

 Strongest winds from early Saturday morning into Saturday Evening

Coastal Flood Hazards and Impacts:

- ✓ Sat AM Coastal Flood Advisory Minor to locally moderate coastal flood impacts likely (flooding of 1 to locally 2 ft above ground), for vulnerable north shore communities of the twin forks of LI, north shore of LI, and north shore barrier island communities for the Saturday AM high tides. Elsewhere just localized minor impacts.
- Impacts: Several waterfront road closures possible and flooding of shoreline properties. Minor damage to shoreline structures possible.
- Sat Night Minor to locally moderate coastal impacts possible for same area as above.
- Sunday morning More widespread minor flooding possible, expanding into south shore bay communities of LI and Queens.

Shoreline Hazards and Impacts:

- ✓ 4-8' breaking waves along the oceanfront with scattered areas of dune erosion. Overwashes are not likely.
- Minor to moderate erosion and wave splashover along the north shore of Long Island and twin forks from 3 to 5 ft surf during Sat AM through Sun AM high tides.

Timing:

✓ During times of high tide Saturday morning, possibly Saturday evening, and Sunday morning.

Forecast Challenges:

 Forecast for Sat PM and Sun AM high tides will have to refined based on observations of surge and waves during the day Saturday. Sunday AM water levels will likely be forced by Ekman pumping and tidal piling in the bays.

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Event Summary

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- E LI / SE CT Blizzard Warning 12 18" of snow likely, locally 2 ft possible. Strong to damaging winds after midnight thru early Saturday evening. Dangerous to impossible travel with blizzard conditions expected Late Tonight through Saturday.
- NYC, NE NJ, SW CT, S Westchester, W LI Winter Storm Warning 6 12" of snow likely. Strong winds late Tonight thru early Saturday evening. Difficult travel and near blizzard conditions Late Tonight into early Saturday afternoon.
- Minor to locally moderate coastal impacts likely for vulnerable north shore communities of the twin forks of LI, north shore of LI, and north shore barrier island communities for the Saturday AM high tides, possible Sat PM. More widespread minor flooding possible Sunday AM.
