## Overview

- A quick moving disturbance will bring a light to potentially moderate snowfall to the area tonight into Saturday.
- Winter weather advisories have been issued for parts of NYC and Union County, NJ.

### HAZARDS & IMPACTS

- **Total Snowfall:** 1 to 3 inches across Northeast NJ, NYC and western Long Island.
- **Timing:** Late tonight into early Saturday.
- **Impacts:** This will result in slippery travel on snow covered roads across the area.
- **Temperatures:** Below freezing temperatures are expected across the region tonight; upper teens to low 30s.

### NWS ALERTS

- **Winter Weather Advisory :** In effect from 10pm this evening to 1pm Saturday.

### FORECAST CHALLENGES

- The ultimate track of the low pressure system will affect the total snowfall amount. A shift to the north will result in higher amounts and an expansion of the advisories north. A shift to the south will lessen amounts.

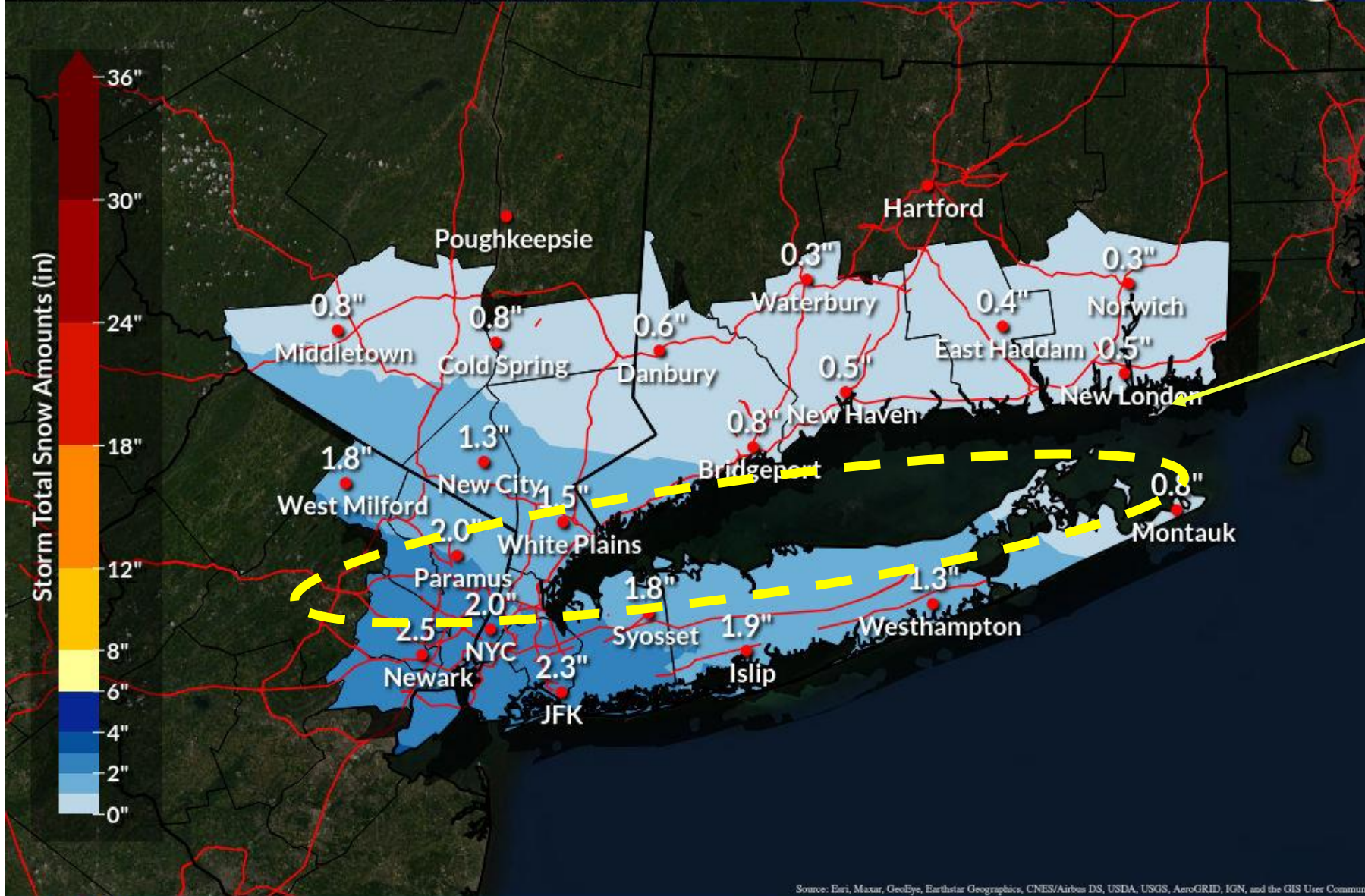

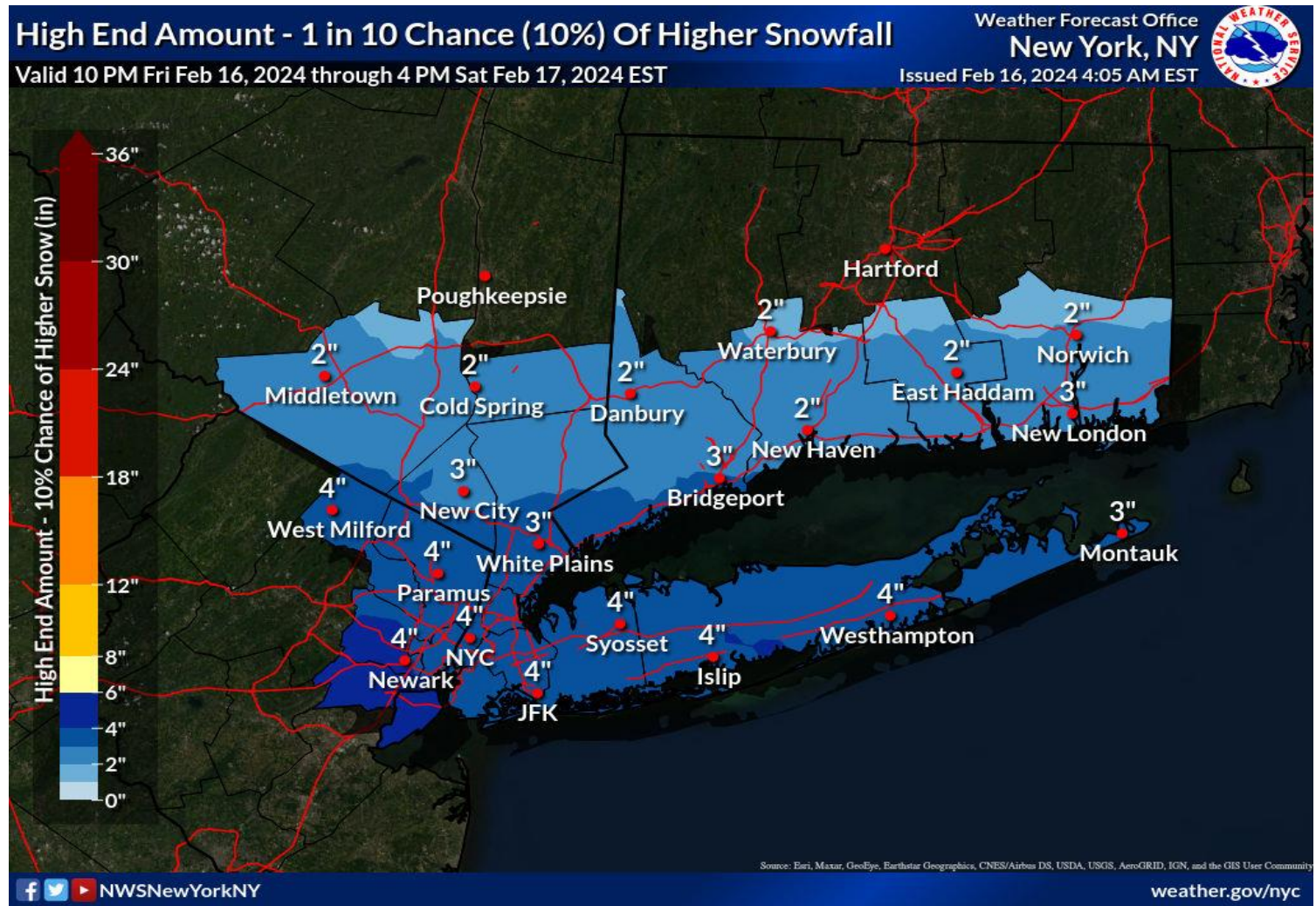

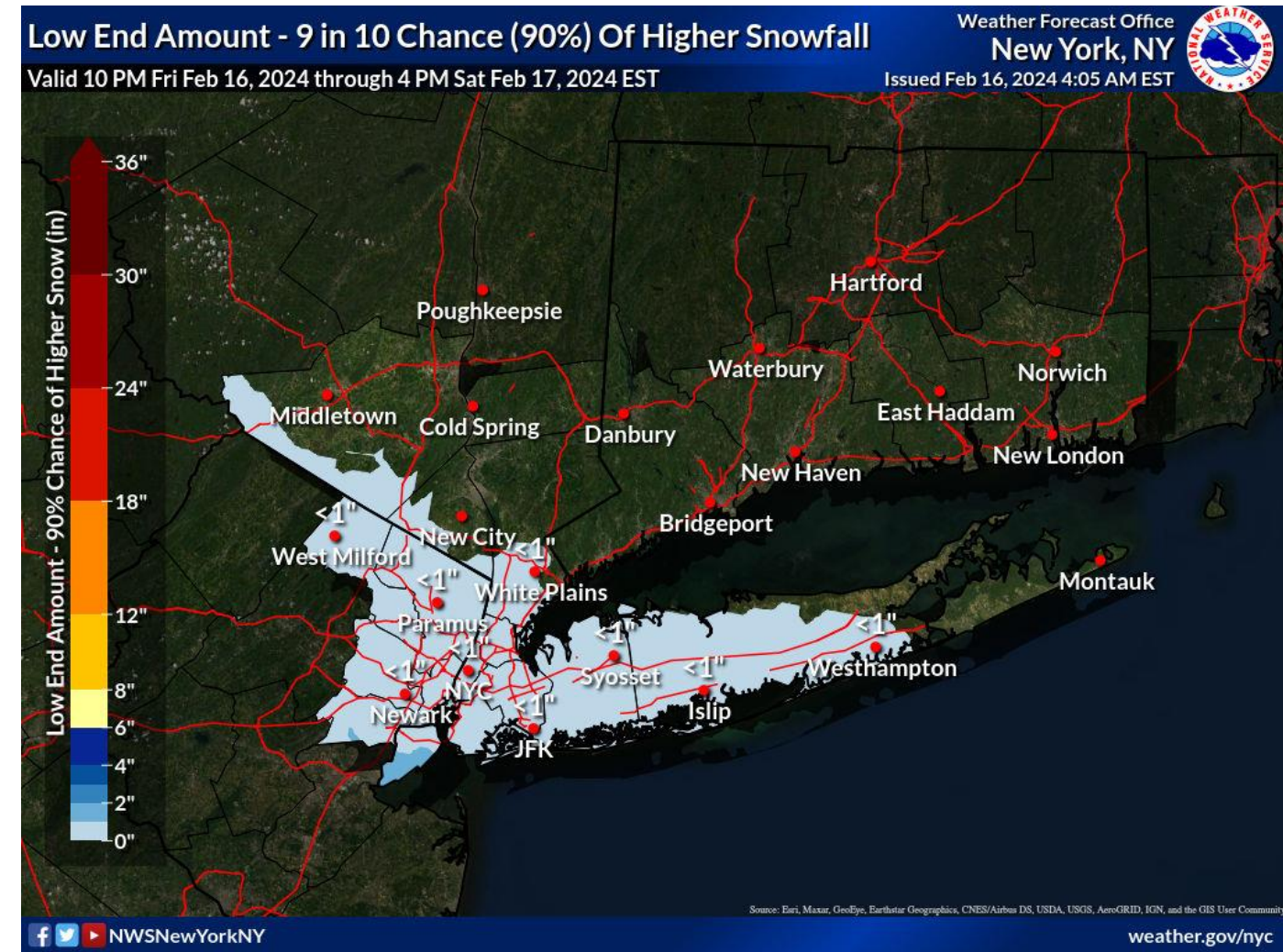


# Probabilistic Snowfall Forecast
