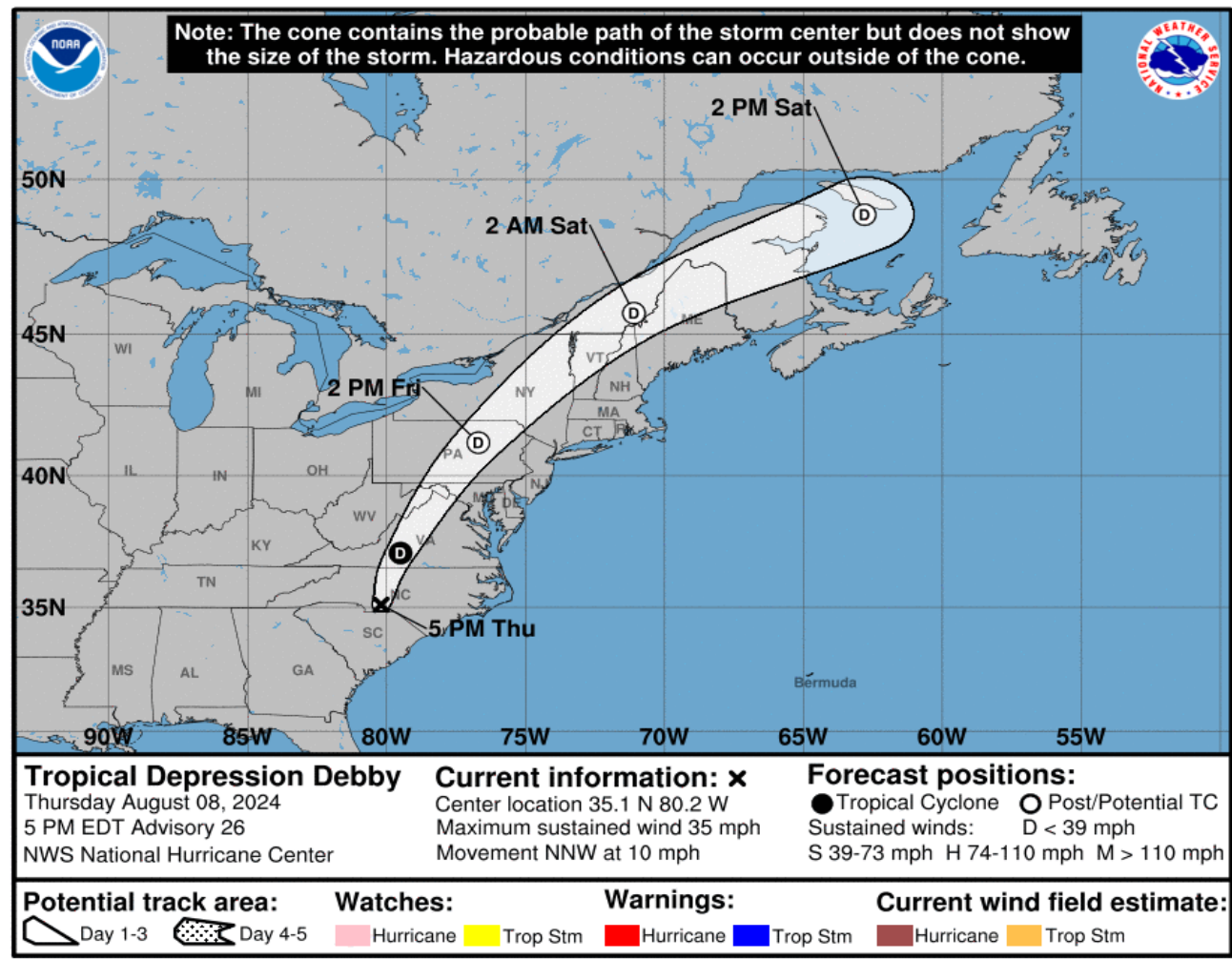




Key Messages

- Post Tropical Depression Debby will bring a period of heavy rain, isolated strong to severe thunderstorms, strong winds, and high surf and dangerous rip currents to the area Fri into early Sat AM



HAZARDS & IMPACTS

- Rainfall:**
- Storm Total Rainfall:** 1 to 2" area wide thru early Sat AM. Locally 3" possible N&W of NYC.
 - Rainfall Rates:** Generally ½ to 1" /hr , locally 2"/hr possible Fri aft/Night
 - Flash Flood Impacts:** Scattered instances of flash flooding of urban & poor drainage areas and along quick responding small rivers and streams possible for NE NJ, Lo Hud, and SW CT Fri aft into Fri Night. Isolated flash flood threat for remainder of the area. Saturated grounds from recent rainfall could exacerbate flood impacts.
- Winds:**
- Peak Winds:** South winds 20 to 30 mph with gust 35 to 45 mph likely Fri aft into night. Gusts to 50 mph possible for LI and NYC late Fri aft into Fri eve.
 - Impacts:** Scattered downed trees and tree limbs. Power outages possible.
- Isolated to Scattered Severe Thunderstorms:**
- Potential for isolated to scattered severe storms with damaging winds gusts and brief tornadoes Fri Aft into Friday night. There is a brief secondary threat along the coast Fri AM as well.
- Coastal:**
- High Surf (6 to 12 ft) and High Risk of rip currents along ocean beaches likely Friday into Saturday. Beach flooding and scattered areas of dune erosion possible during times of high tide Friday into midday Saturday.
- Marine:**
- Gale conditions and 8 to 12 ft waves on the ocean. 3 to 5 ft on LIS Fri aft into Sat AM.

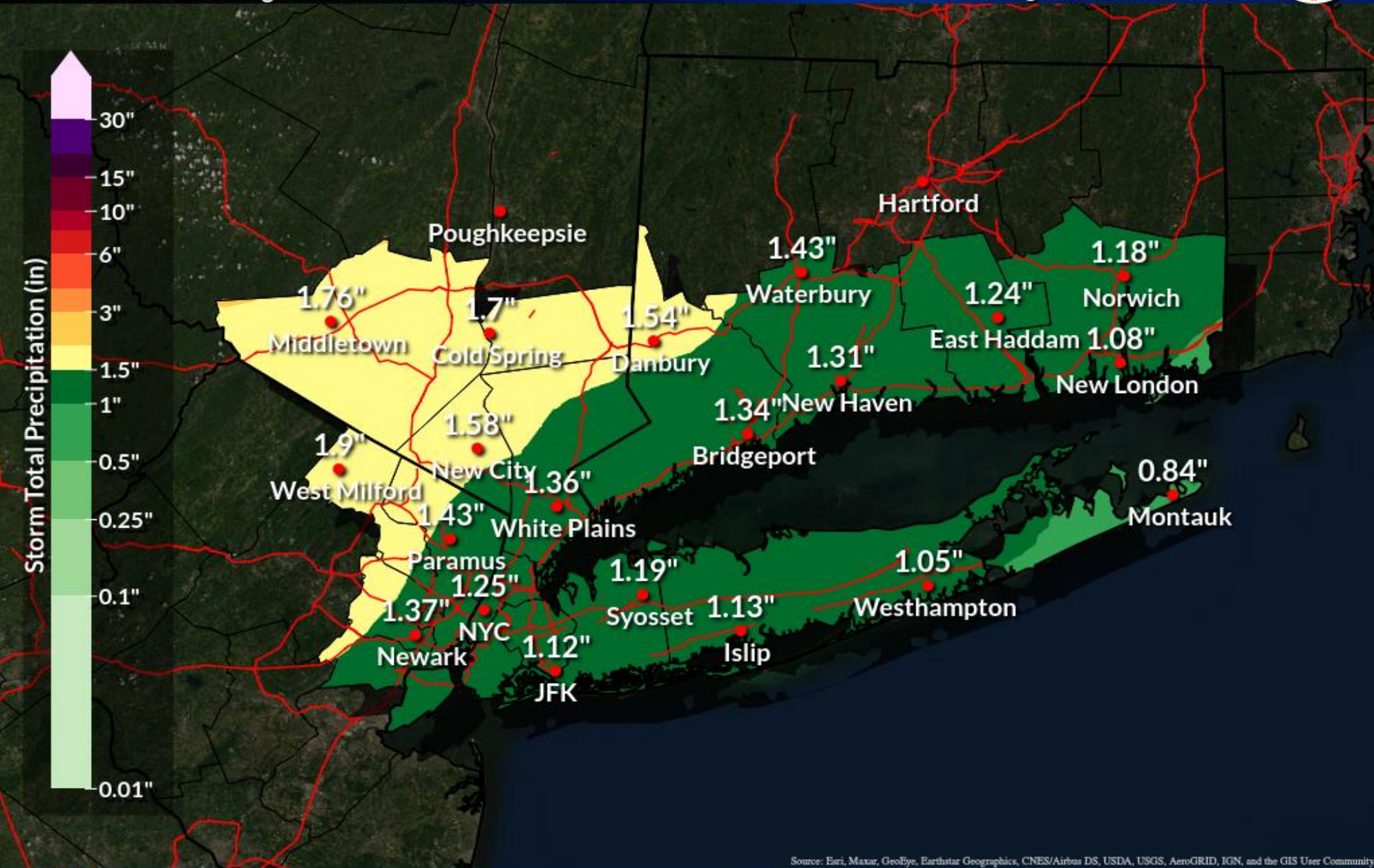

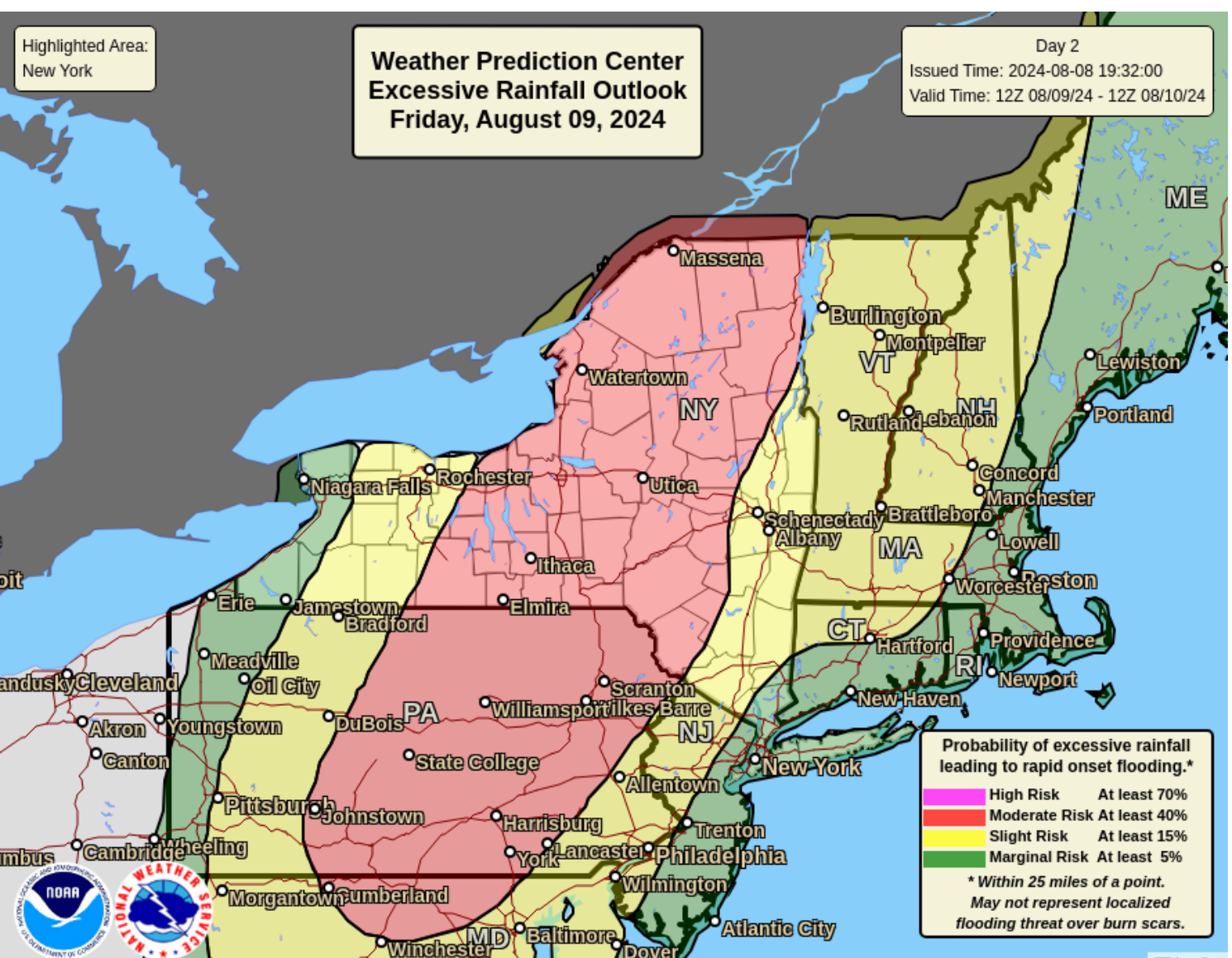

Understanding WPC Excessive Rainfall Risk Categories

No Area/Label	MARGINAL (MRGL)	SLIGHT (SLGT)	MODERATE (MDT)	HIGH (HIGH)
Flash floods are generally not expected.	Isolated flash floods possible	Scattered flash floods possible	Numerous flash floods likely	Widespread flash floods expected
Localized and primarily affecting places that can experience rapid runoff with heavy rainfall.	Mainly localized. Most vulnerable are urban areas, roads, small streams and washes. Isolated significant flash floods possible.	Numerous flash flooding events with significant events possible. Many streams may flood, potentially affecting larger rivers.	Severe, widespread flash flooding. Areas that don't normally experience flash flooding, could. Lives and property in greater danger.

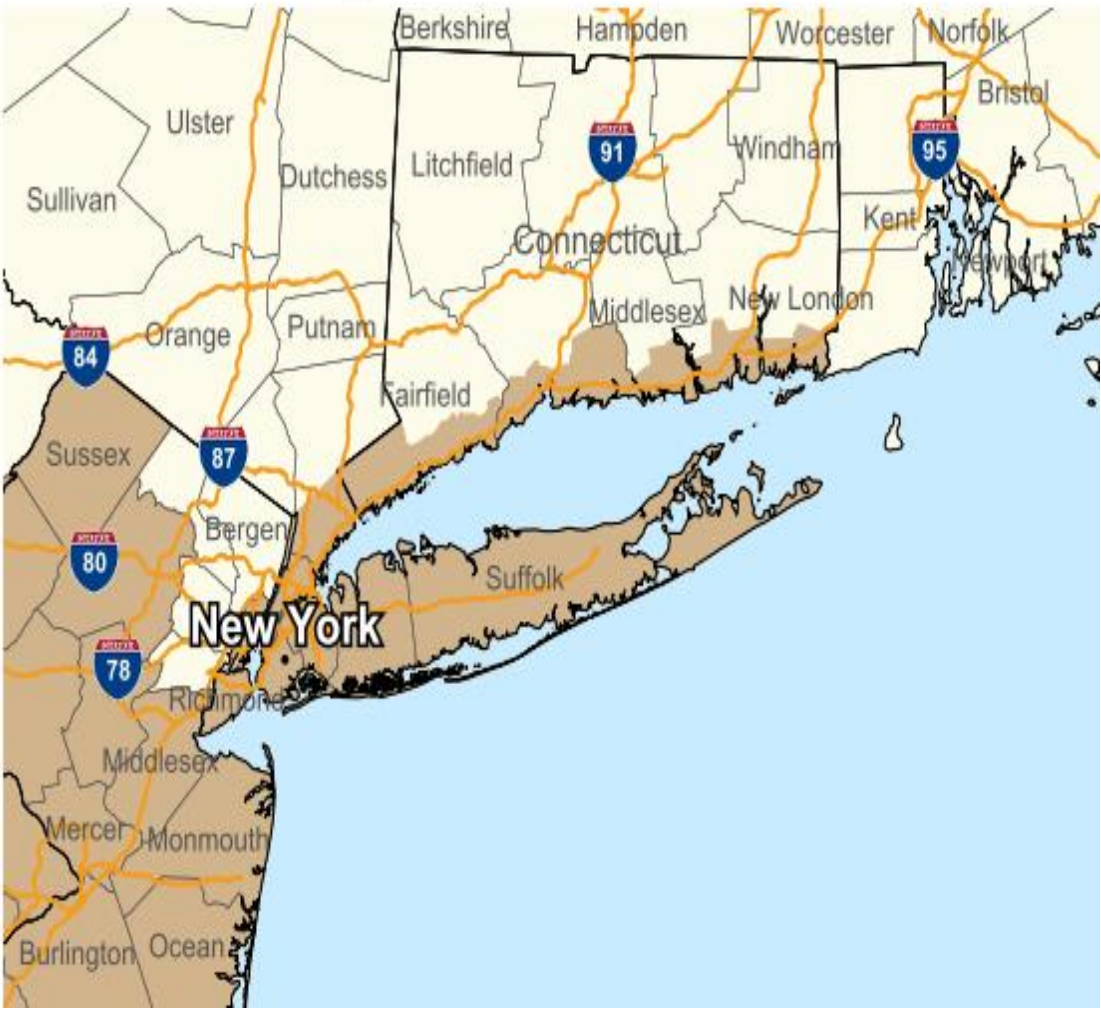
Friday Maximum Wind Gust Forecast

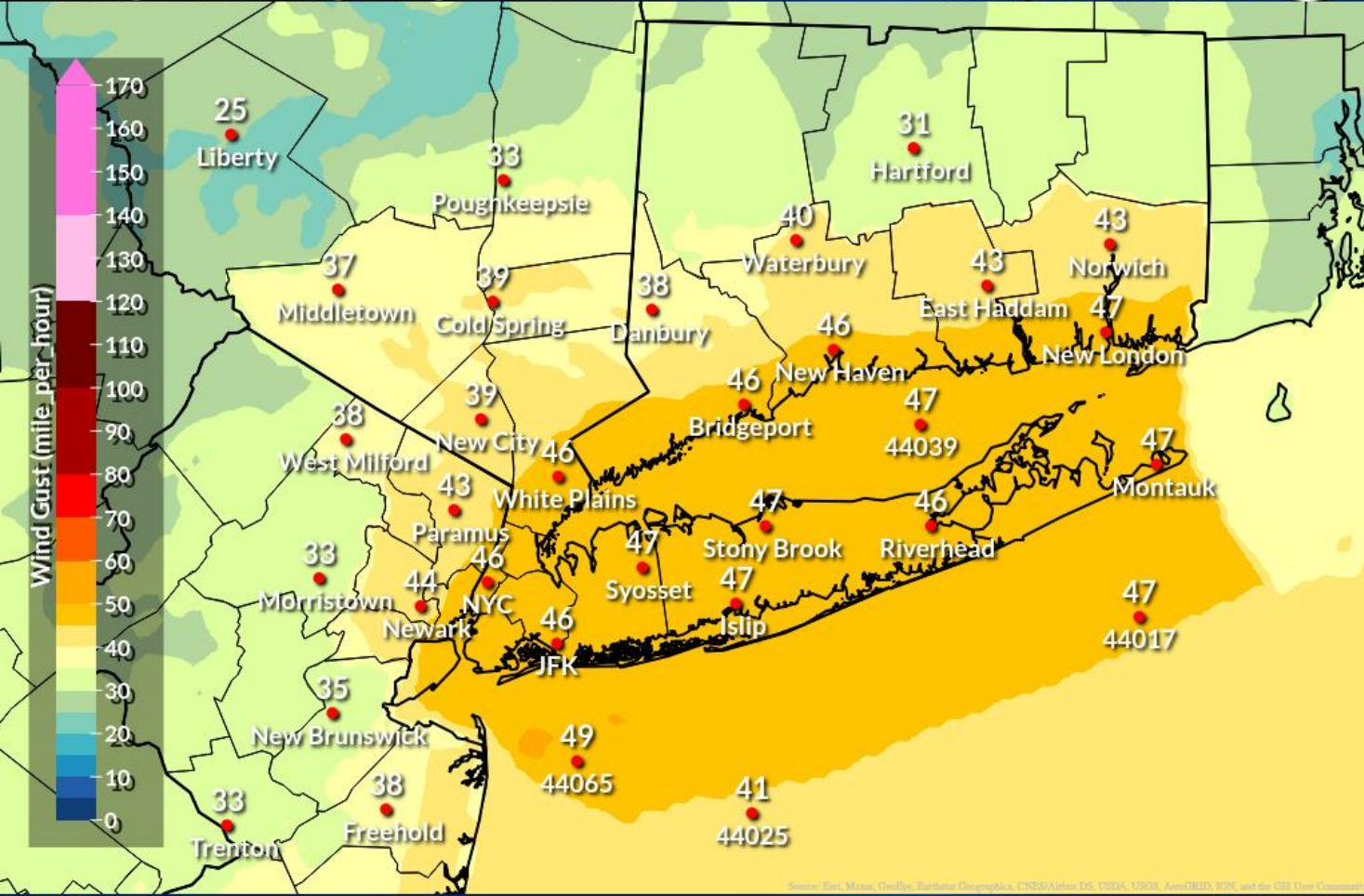

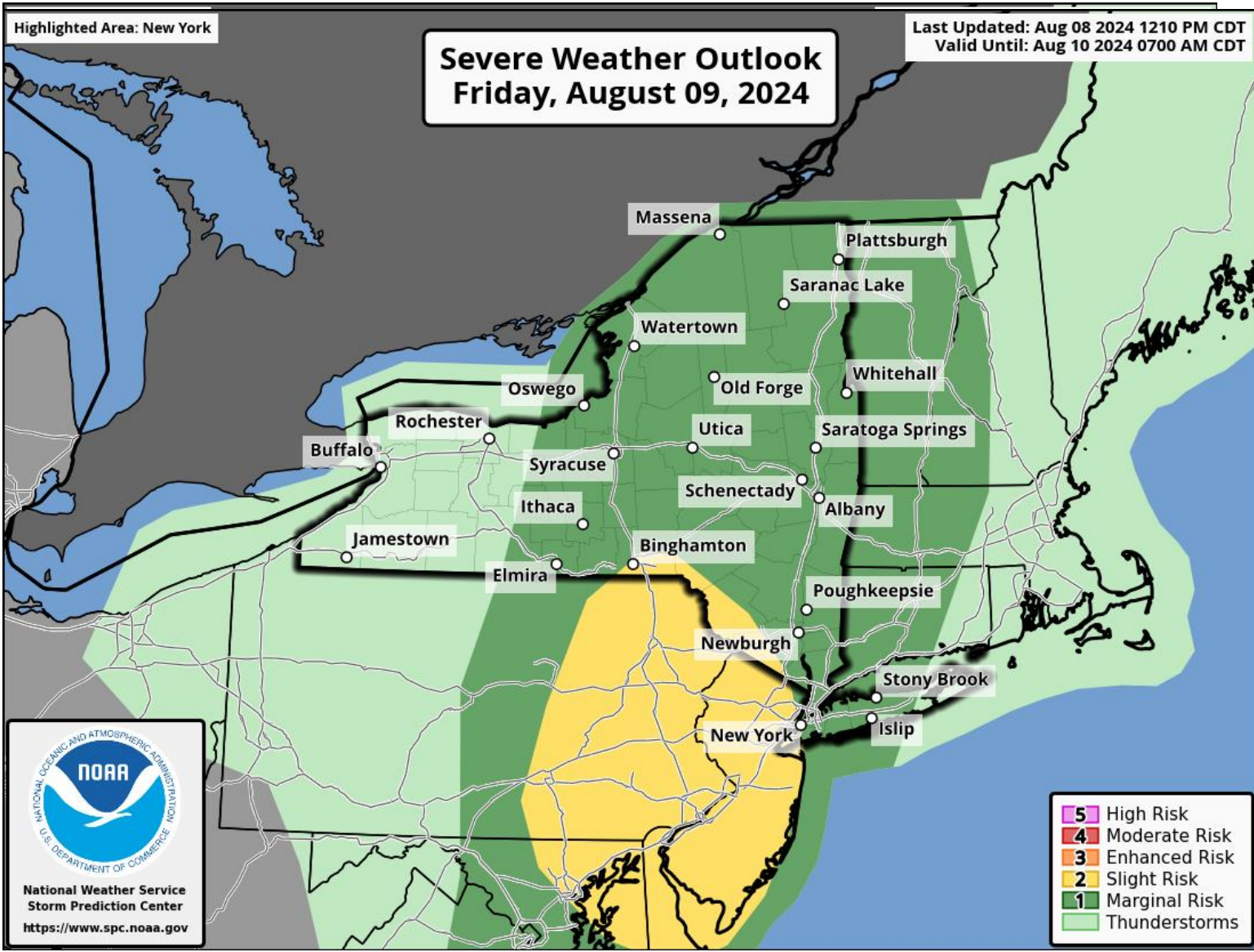

	General Thunderstorm	Although severe weather is not expected, <i>all</i> thunderstorms can produce deadly lightning, gusty winds, and small hail.	No severe thunderstorms expected		Similar to storms your area experiences many times per year	Severe Storm Any storm that contains at least one of the following: Wind gusts of at least 58 mph Hail at least one inch in diameter Tornado
1	Marginal (MRGL)	Some storms could be capable of damaging winds and severe hail. Localized tornado threat could develop.	Isolated severe storms possible		Similar to storms your area may experience several times per year	
2	Slight (SLGT)	Increased confidence that some storms will contain damaging winds, severe hail, and/or tornado potential. <i>A few severe storms could be significant</i>	Isolated to scattered severe storms expected		Similar to storms your area may experience a few times per year	
3	Enhanced (ENH)	High confidence that several storms will contain damaging winds, severe hail, and/or tornadoes. <i>Several severe storms could be significant</i>	Scattered to numerous severe storms expected		Similar to intense storms your area may only experience once or twice per year	Significant Severe Any of the following hazards: Wind gusts of at least 75 mph Hail at least two inches in diameter Tornado of at least EF-2 rating
4	Moderate (MDT)	High confidence that many storms will contain damaging winds, severe hail, and/or tornadoes. <i>Several severe storms likely to be significant</i>	Scattered to numerous severe storms expected		Similar to intense storms your area may only experience once per year or less	
5	High (HIGH)	High confidence that an outbreak of storms will contain tornadoes, damaging winds, and/or severe hail. <i>Tornado outbreak and/or widespread damaging winds</i>	Numerous severe storms expected		Very intense storms your area may only experience once or twice in a lifetime
