## Flash Flooding Potential Today into Early Thursday

#### **OVERVIEW**

- Heavy rain from the remnants of Ida bring potential flash flooding to the region today into early Thursday.
- There is a Moderate to High risk of excessive rainfall leading to flash flooding.
- A chance of thunderstorms late this afternoon into tonight. Damaging winds are possible. Brief isolated tornadoes also possible.

HAZARDS & IMPACTS

• Storm Total Rainfall: 3 to 6 inches, with locally higher amounts possible.

■ Rainfall Rates: 1 to 2"/hour at times.

- Impacts: Scattered to widespread flash flooding of urban and poor drainage areas as well as small streams and creaks is likely. Rises on main stem rivers are possible, which could lead to additional flooding.
- Tornadoes: An isolated tornado cannot be ruled out, especially near the coast.
- Coastal Flooding: Minor mainly near Peconic Bay for Eastern Long Island.

Flood Watches Warnings and Advisories



TIMING

Flash Flood Threat: Today into early Thursday.

■ Isolated Tornado Threat: Late this afternoon into tonight.

Coastal Flood Threat: Tonight during high tide.

NWS ALERTS

Flash Flood Watch: 8am Today until 2pm Thursday.

CHALLENGES FORECAST

Highest rainfall amounts along Northeast NJ, Lower Hudson Valley and Southern CT. Some slight adjustments to the axis of heavy rainfall may occur, but there is moderate to high confidence in the threat for flash flooding across the entire area.

Abnormally wet conditions so far this summer have resulted in higher than normal streamflow and water tables, which elevates the flash flood threat.





#### **MARGINAL** (MRGL)

Isolated flash floods possible

Localized and primarily affecting places that can experience rapid runoff with heavy rainfall.

### SLIGHT (SLGT)

Scattered flash floods possible

Mainly localized, Most vulnerable are urban areas, roads, small streams and washes. Isolated significant flash floods possible.

### **MODERATE** (MDT)

Numerous flash floods likely

Numerous flash flooding events with significant events possible. Many streams may flood, potentially affecting larger rivers.

#### HIGH (HIGH)

Widespread flash floods expected

Severe, widespread flash flooding. Areas that don't normally experience flash flooding, could. Lives and property in greater danger.












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### Severe Thunderstorm Threat (Isolated Tornado Possible)
