What Has Changed?

 Wind Advisories expanded. Now includes all of Coastal CT, Southern and Eastern Long Island, and Southern Westchester County..

Minor coastal flooding. Inundation of 0.5 ft above ground in vulnerable areas. Scattered areas of dune

erosion possible.

Snow / Heavy Wet Snow



Forecast Challenges:

There is some uncertainty on the eastern extent and duration of moderate and heavy snow banding late tonight into Friday for Orange County. Higher snowfall amounts are possible across western Orange county.

Hazards and Impacts:

Locations - Orange County, NY

- ✓ Winter Weather Advisory: now 10am Fri
- ✓ Snow Accum: 3-8" / locally higher amounts possible
- A warning level snowfall is possible (>6") mainly north and west of I-84 from Port Jervis to Montgomery.
- ✓ **Snowfall rates:** Up to 1"/hr possible
- Snow Character: Wet

Locations – Western Passaic, NJ

- ✓ Winter Weather Advisory: now 1am Fri
- ✓ Snow Accum: 2-3"
- Highest totals expected along the far western border with Sussex County.
- ✓ Snow Character: Wet

Impacts:

- Difficult travel especially higher elevations.
- ✓ Scattered downed tree limbs and power lines.

Timing:

✓ Heaviest snow from 8pm tonight through 2am Friday.












Most Likely Snowfall – Official Forecast















Probabilistic Snowfall Forecast







Heavy Rain



Hazards:

- ✓ Rainfall of 1.0 to 2.0 inches across the entire Tri State.
- ✓ Rainfall rates of 0.25 to 0.5"/hr

Impacts -

- Localized minor flooding possible.
- Urban and poor drainage areas most likely impacted.

Timing:

✓ Heaviest rain from 8pm tonight through 8am Friday.

Forecast Challenges:

Confidence is increasing in forecast rainfall amounts. Localized flood impacts may be locally enhanced due to poor drainage.











Strong/Damaging Winds



Forecast Challenges:

Confidence is increasing in these winds occurring, but wind/gust speeds could increase or decrease by 5-10 mph or so based on storm track and intensity.

Hazards and Impacts:

Wind advisories for eastern and southern Long Island, coastal CT, and southern Westchester

- ✓ Peak Winds: East winds of 25 to 35 mph with gusts 45 to 50 mph, across Long Island and Southern CT.
- ✓ Timing: 4am to 6pm Friday.
- ✓ Impacts: Scattered downed tree limbs and power lines are possible in these areas.
- Any unsecured objects (outdoor decorations) may be blown around.
- ✓ Strongest winds from 2am Friday through 6pm Friday.

Coastal Flooding

Coastal Flood Hazards and Impacts:

- Minor coastal flooding tonight and Friday afternoon. Isolated locally moderate coastal flooding is possible on Friday.
- ✓ Inundation of 0.5 ft above ground in vulnerable locations including S and E Bays of LI, and W LI Sound today.

Shoreline Hazards and Impacts:

- ✓ 2-4 ft. of breaking waves along the oceanfront today, increasing to 4 to 8' on Friday.
- Localized dune erosion possible during Friday afternoon.

Timing:

✓ During times of high tide this afternoon and Friday morning/afternoon.









Event Summary

A coastal low pressure will affect the region through Friday.

- ✓ A period heavy wet snow is likely for far western portions of Orange and Western Passaic Counties. Higher snowfall amounts are possible especially across higher elevation (1000 ft.) areas in Orange County. Winter weather advisories are in effect for these locations.
- Heavy rainfall for much of the rest of the Tri State may lead to local urban and poor drainage flooding early Friday.
- ✓ A period of easterly wind gusts of 30-35 mph, with gusts up to 50 mph over coastal areas and the waters late tonight into Friday morning. Wind advisories are in effect for eastern and southern Long Island as well as coastal CT and southern Westchester on Friday.
- ✓ Isolated minor coastal flooding along the south shore bays of Long Island and western Long Island Sound tonight. Widespread minor coastal flooding potential along NY Harbor, Long Island, and Coastal CT. Isolated moderate coastal flood potential for southern bays of LI.
