

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**NOTE:** Do not focus on the exact track. Impacts can occur well outside the area enclosed by the cone.

- Tropical storm warning and flash flood watch continues for the entire local area.
- Fay continues to move north/northeast at 10 mph.
- Impacts from heavy rain/flooding and winds to begin this morning.


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


#### Current Radar View

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#### Tropical Storm Fay




- Showers and thunderstorms will primarily be limited to coastal areas through the early morning.
- Rain bands will begin to move inland by late morning.

#### Earliest Reasonable Time of Arrival

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- The earliest reasonable time of arrival of Tropical Storm Force Winds (39+ mph) for the area is 2pm today.
- However, the most likely time this area could see Tropical Storm Force
   Winds will be late this afternoon.


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#### Tornado Potential

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


 Main threat of isolated tornadoes is late this morning into this evening.

#### Tropical Storm Fay



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Strong wind gusts expected for the entire area, this afternoon into early Saturday.



Flash flooding from heavy rainfall is possible today for the entire Tri-State area.



Isolated weak tornadoes are possible today, for the entire Tri-State area.



Dangerous marine conditions expected across the coastal waters today into Saturday.

Looking ahead, Saturday and Sunday look to be hot and humid, with heat indices in the low to mid 90s for NYC, LI, northern NJ and southwest CT.
