## Winter Weather Advisory in Effect Late Tonight into Early Afternoon for Much of the Area

### Key Messages

- Travel impacts are expected for the Thursday morning commute due to a wintry mix of snow, sleet, and freezing rain.
- The wintry mix changes to plain rain from south to north late Thursday morning into the afternoon.

### What Has Changed?

- Winter Weather Advisories have been expanded to include all of the NYC metro, NE NJ, Westchester, and southern CT.

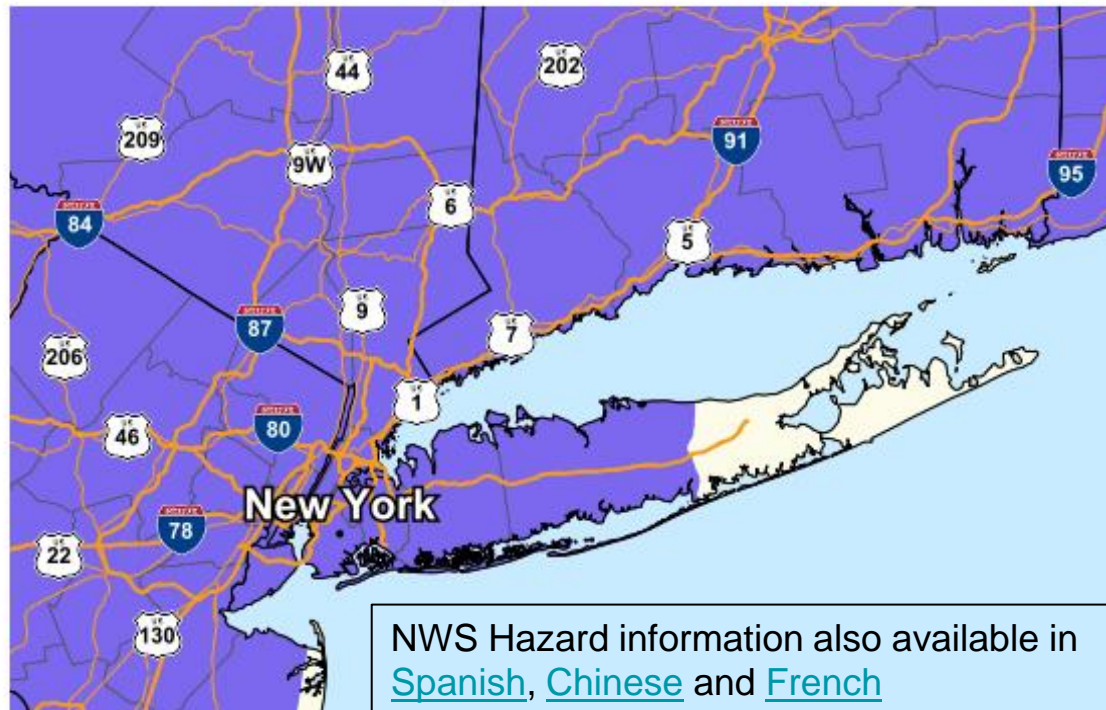
### HAZARDS & IMPACTS

- Total Snowfall:** Up to two inches for most locations except around one inch for southern portions of the NYC metro and Long Island.
- Ice Accretion:** A glaze across portions of NYC metro, western Long Island, and coastal CT. Up to one tenth further inland. Freezing rain is currently not expected across eastern Long Island.
- Timing:** Snow develops from southwest to northeast after midnight, mixing with sleet and freezing rain by mid to late morning, before tapering as plain rain by afternoon. The coast and NYC metro will change to rain by late morning. There is also potential for some lingering freezing rain across the interior where freezing temperatures take longest to scour out.
- Impacts:** Hazardous travel during the Thursday morning commute due to snow covered and icy roads, especially on untreated roads and surfaces.

### NWS ALERTS

- Winter Weather Advisory:** Interior NE New Jersey, Lower Hudson Valley, Southern Connecticut from 4 AM Thursday until 1 PM Thursday. For NYC metro and western Long Island, the Advisory is in effect 4 AM Thursday until 11 AM Thursday.

### FORECAST CHALLENGES

- Snow and/or ice amounts may be slightly higher if colder air remains in place a bit longer.
- Snow and ice amounts may be lower if warmer air is faster to move across the area, especially closer to the coast.

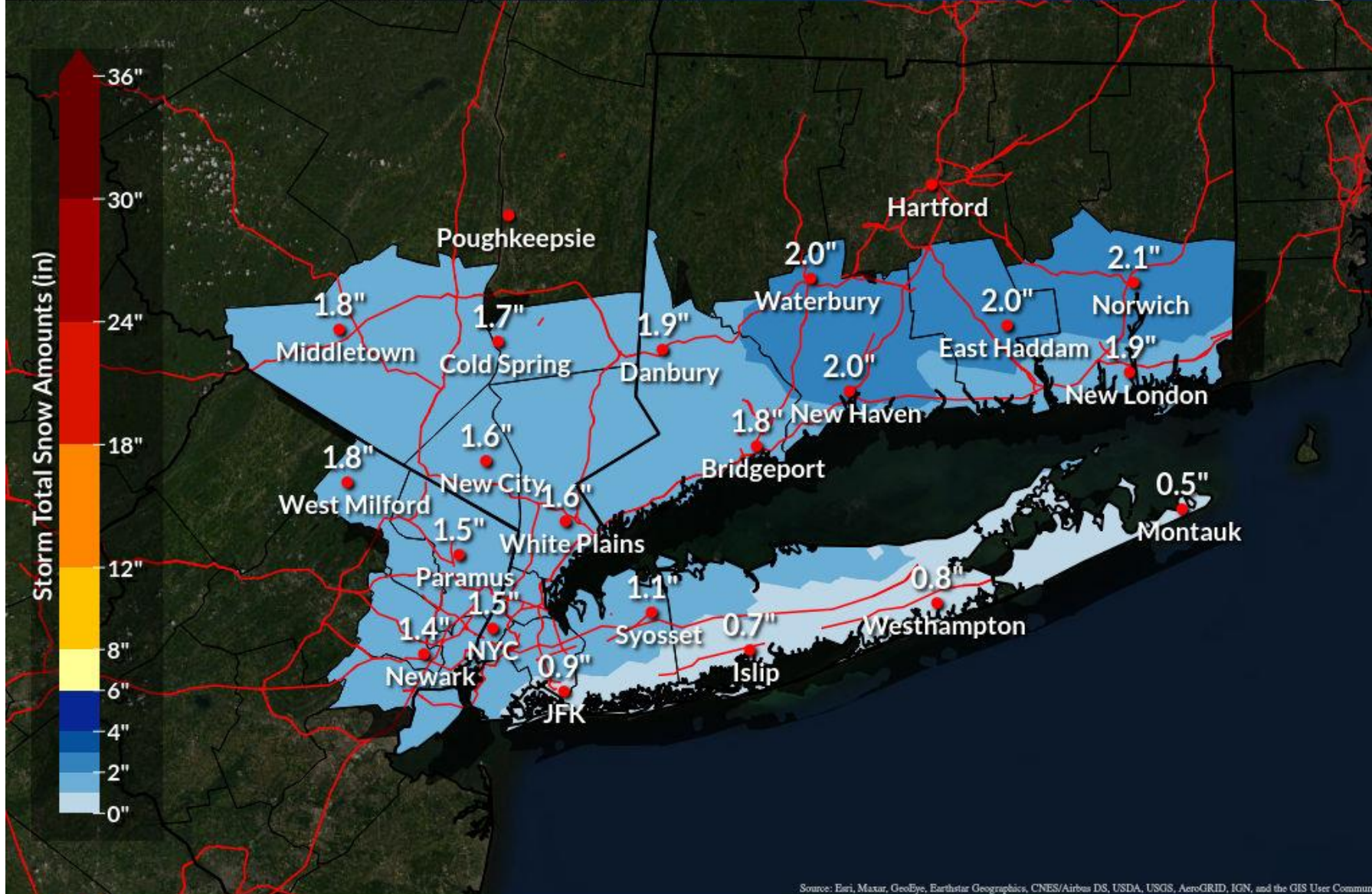
## Expected Snowfall - Official NWS Forecast

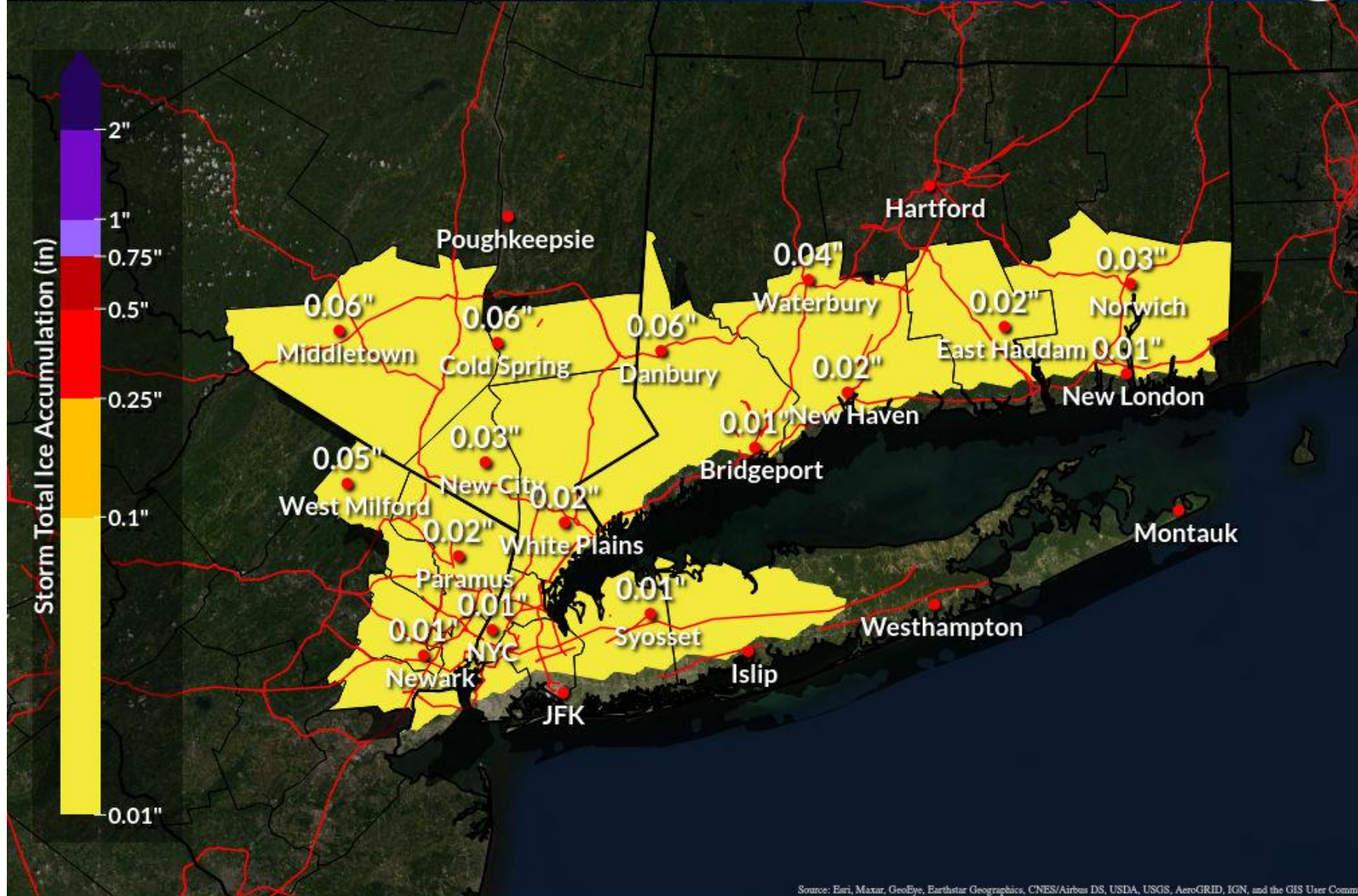
## Expected Ice Accumulation - Official NWS Forecast
