

What Has Changed?

✓ Snowfall amounts increased for most of the Tri-State

Heavy Snow	 10-18" possible for NYC, NE NJ, much of Long Island, portions of Lower Hudson Valley and southern CT. 6-12" across n Orange County, Putnan County, and forks of Long Island. Snowfall rates of 1-3"/hr This afternoon and tonight. Near white-out conditions at times. 	Entire Tri-State Region	Today and tonight
Strong Winds	 20 to 30 MPH with gusts to 45 mph, isolated gusts to 50 mph on the Twin Forks. Widespread power outages possible. Widespread downed trees and power lines possible. 	Entire Tri-State Region Strongest gusts closest to the coast	Late morning through this evening
Coastal Impacts	 Minor to moderate coastal flooding. Inundation of 1 to 3 ft above ground in vulnerable areas. Localized dune erosion. 	Vulnerable locales along NY/NJ Harbor, Jamaica Bay, S and E Bays of LI, and LI Sound	During times of high tide today and tonight
Marine	 Wind gusts up to 55 KT on the ocean. 35 to 45 KT on all other waters. Seas of 11-16 ft on the Ocean and 3-7 ft on LI Sound. 	Nearshore and coastal ocean waters	Late morning through this evening












Summary of Greatest Impacts














Heavy snow



Hazards:

- Snowfall of 10-18" for NYC, NE NJ, much of Long Island, portions of the Lower Hudson Valley and southern CT.
- √ 6-12" across Orange, Putnam and the Forks of Long Island.
- ✓ Near white-out conditions at times.
- √ 1-3" per hour at times.

Impacts:

- Widespread downed trees, tree limbs and powerlines possible.
- Difficult/Impossible travel.

Timing:

Heaviest snow late morning through around midnight.







Coastal Flooding



Coastal Flood Hazards and Impacts:

- Minor to Moderate coastal flooding.
- ✓ Inundation of 1 to 2 ft above ground in vulnerable areas.
 - ✓ 2-3 ft above ground for south shore of western Long Island tonight.

Shoreline Hazard and Impacts:

Localized dune erosion.

Timing:

During times of high tide today and tonight.

*Coastal Flood Watch for tonight for south shore Bays of NYC and Western Long Island

























Approximate End of Precipitation





Forecast Uncertainties

- ✓ The location and timing of heaviest snowfall.
- ✓ The temperatures, especially during the day time.
- ✓ How much mixing with sleet, if any, occurs?







Event Summary

- ✓ Accumulating heavy, wet snow and gusty winds could cause widespread power outages and widespread tree damage.
 - ✓ Near blizzard conditions possible across NYC, Nassau County, SW CT and portions of NE NJ and the Lower Hudson Valley.
 - ✓ Snowfall rates 1 to 3" per hour, late this morning through around midnight.
- ✓ Hazardous travel possible developing by around midday and becoming nearly impossible for the afternoon and evening commute.
- ✓ Minor to moderate coastal impacts with the high tides today and tonight.
