What Has Changed?

- ✓ Winter Storm Warning Issued for most of the Tri-State
- Winter Storm Watch Remains in effect for New London County and most of Suffolk County







Winter Storm Warning: 10pm tonight To 4am Thursday

Strong Winds	 15 to 30 mph with gusts up to 40 mph. Any downed trees and power lines will cause power outages. Near white out conditions possible at times, especially across the interior. 	The Tri-State Area	Wednesday Afternoon and Night










Summary of Greatest Impacts


















Heavy Snow


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- ✓ Total Snow Accumulation 6-15" in Warning Area, highest across interior Lower Hudson Valley and S CT
- Total Snow Accumulation in Watch Area 3-12", mixed precipitation is limiting factor
- Gusty winds may down additional trees and power lines
- Gusty winds may cause near-white out conditions at times
- Plan on hazardous travel conditions, including during the morning and particularly the evening commute on Wednesday.












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
Heavy Snow

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High End Amount - 1 in 10 Chance (10%) Of Higher Snowfall

Low End Amount - 9 in 10 Chance (90%) Of Higher Snowfall Valid: 03/06/2018 07:00 PM - 03/08/2018 07:00 AM



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Forecast Uncertainty

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- ✓ Storm Track and Strength are still uncertain
- A further offshore track will bring less snowfall to the interior, but more snow to coastal areas, due to less mixing with rain
- A storm track closer to the coast could bring more rain, especially for coastal areas, but higher snowfall amounts over the interior
- Wind and coastal flood impacts are closely tied to the strength, size and exact track of the storm











Event Summary

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- Exact snow totals will be determined by ultimate track of the storm
- Heaviest precipitation falls from Wednesday morning into Wednesday evening.
- Hazardous travel expected Wednesday evening across most, if not all the Tri-State
- Widespread minor to locally moderate coastal flooding possible during high tide Wednesday afternoon and late Wednesday night/early Thursday morning
