
Ophelia Continues to Impact the Local Area Through Sunday

OVERVIEW

Ophelia will continue to weaken across the Mid Atlantic states tonight into Sunday with periods of rain, coastal flooding, beach erosion and dangerous rip currents impacting the Tri-State Area.



High surf and dangerous rip currents for ocean beaches through the weekend. Peak breaking surf of 6 to 10 ft tonight into Sunday morning causing beach erosion/flooding and scattered areas of dune erosion during times of high tide. Localized overwash potential is low, unless dune system is compromised. Breaking surf will subside, but continue at 4 to 7 ft Sun into early next week.

- Rainfall: An additional 1 to 2 inches, locally higher, through Monday afternoon.
 - Peak Rainfall rates: 1/4 to 1/2"/hr possible, possibly higher rainfall rates Sunday afternoon and Sunday night.
 - Impacts: Minor urban and poor drainage flood threat, as well as along quicker responding rivers and streams. Any flash flooding is expected to be isolated.
- Peak Winds: Winds 25 to 30 mph w/gusts of 40 mph across coastal locations into tonight. Gusts subsiding to 25-30 mph Sun into Mon.
 - Impacts: Potential for scattered downed tree branches due to full foliage into tonight. A few power outages are possible.
- Minor coastal flooding (Up to 1 ft of inundation AGL) expected along vulnerable locations of coastal Westchester and Fairfield counties for the eve high tidal cycle. Elsewhere across LI/NYC a localized minor coastal flood threat.
 - Localized minor coastal flooding is possible for these locations with the Sunday aft/eve high tide. Then possibly a more widespread minor coastal flooding threat for the early next week aft/eve high tides.







Additional rounds of minor coastal flooding are possible Sunday into early next week for this area.

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
Expected Rainfall - Official NWS Forecast Valid: 09/23/2023 02:00 PM - 09/25/2023 08:00 PM EDT
