Bridgeport:



at 13.3 ft MLLW / 6.0 ft MHHW (Hurricane Sandy)

Widespread record coastal flooding occurred along Western Long Island Sound. Along the Southern Fairfield coast, peak storm tides surpassed water levels from the October 31, 1991 and December 11, 1992 nor'easters and the recorded peaks from Hurricane Irene in 2011 and the 1938 Hurricane. The record storm tide levels along Western Long Island Sound resulted from a peak storm surge of about 8 to 9 feet that coincided with normal high tides. These storm tides resulted in up to 2 to 5 feet of inundation several blocks inland along Long Island Sound, with a few feet of inundation working north of I-95 in several spots along waterways such as the Pequannock River in Bridgeport, Ash Creek and Mill River in Fairfield, Saugatuck River in Westport, and Norwalk River in Norwalk. The most widespread major damage occurred in Bridgeport and Fairfield townships, with isolated pockets of heavy damage, such as in Greenwich. at 12.1 ft MLLW / 4.8 ft MHHW (Hurricane Irene)

<u>Bridgeport</u> – Water from LI Sound came up through Bridgeport Harbor and flooded <u>Bridgeport</u> <u>train station tracks</u>. (800am 8/28/2011) 7.54 ft MLLW? Inundation of Bridgeport Ferry dock with 1 to 3 ft of water. (930-1000am 8/28/2011)



<u>Fairfield</u> – Multiple sections of <u>Richard White Way</u> closed due to inundation by feet of water.(940am 8/28/2011) (Fresh Water/Coastal flooding) Water inundation <u>1/2 mile inland on Fairfield Beach Rd past 1 Rod Highway</u>. (930-1000am 8/28/2011)

<u>Milford</u> – Business along <u>Broadway near Naugatuck Avenue in Milford</u> were inundated with 1 to 2 feet of water.

Along the <u>immediate shoreline sections of East Broadway</u> up to 8 ft of inundation was reported by police.

<u>Westport</u> – One ft of water over US1 and rising...Saugatuck River is out of its banks...closures along Saugutuck River near <u>Riverside and Imperial Ave</u>. (1015am 8/28/2011)

at 12.0 ft MLLW / 4.7 ft MHHW (December 92 Nor'easter)

Norwalk, Westport, Fairfield and Milford had sought the state's help in removing residents from flooded areas. Waters were so powerful that 2.5-ton National Guard vehicles sent to those areas were not adequate, and 5-ton vehicles and even the Guard's two 20-ton vehicles had to be summoned.

Killed 3 people and destroyed 26 homes in Connecticut. The storm caused \$4.3 million in damages to over 6,000 homes. Tides in Long Island Sound stacked up due to the 55 MPH winds which resulted in the third highest tide of 9.2 feet NAVD 88 measured in Bridgeport, CT eroded shorelines and damaged homes (DEP, 2007)

<u>Shippan Point</u> - waterfront mansions stood in three-foot-deep water as waves from the sound crashed over walls.

<u>Fairfield</u> - payloaders, boats and a Coast Guard helicopter were used to rescue people stranded along roads near the sound. <u>Fairfield Beach Rd</u>...several ft of inundation with sand overwash along the shore...moving inland $\frac{1}{2}$ mile in spots. 60 buildings damaged to the point that they could not be re-entered.



<u>Westport</u> - the noontime high tide cut off the <u>Saugatuck Shores</u> and <u>Compo Beach areas</u> and flooded an estimated 300 cars at the <u>town's main Metro-North Commuter Railroad station</u>. The tide also surged up the Saugatuck River, flooding <u>the Post Road and Westport's shopping district</u> <u>along Main Street</u>.



<u>Norwalk</u> – <u>Water St</u> and part of Mack St were closed due to flooding. 1+ ft of inundation on <u>Mack</u> <u>St</u>.

<u>Fairfield</u> - Fire Department Special Service Unit 1 helped to evacuate residents of <u>Fairfield Beach</u> <u>road</u> as flood waters continued to rise early Saturday afternoon. At one point, the road was impassable from the <u>1200 block on</u>.

<u>Bridgeport</u> - Shortly before 2 p.m., the parking lot to a waterfront condominium complex on <u>Beachview Avenue in Bridgeport's Black Rock section</u> was said to be underwater as a result of flooding along Ash Creek.

<u>Westport</u> - Several shorefront roads, including <u>Harbor Road</u>, <u>Canal Road</u> and <u>Compo Road South</u> <u>at Compo Beach Road</u>, <u>Wilton Road at Post Road West</u>, <u>Parker Harding Plaza</u> and <u>Imperial</u> <u>Road at Baker Avenue</u>, were all closed as a result of flooding.

<u>1300 block of Fairfield Beach Road</u>, wave action caused some scour of barrier beach. Most properties are, however, protected with some kind of seawall structure. The few not protected saw some beach scour.




