

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


Situation Overview

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NOTE: Do not focus on the exact track. Impacts can occur well outside the area enclosed by the cone.

- What has Changed?
 - Storm will be a bit faster to arrive, stronger winds, and a bit less rainfall, especially east of NYC.
- Isaias is a 70 mph Tropical Storm nearing southeast VA.
- Isaias will only slowly weaken as it accelerates and curves NE to near NYC as a moderately strong tropical storm by late afternoon.
- Confidence is moderate to high on timing of most local hazards and impacts.

TS Wind Speed Probabilities

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Tropical Storm Warning in effect for entire Tri-State.

Likely Hazards

- 45-55 mph gusts to 70 mph along the Coast, including metro NYC/NJ, and southern Westchester
- 35-45 mph gusts to 60 mph across the Interior.

Likely Impacts

- Widespread downed trees and tree limbs
- Scattered to numerous power outages possible
 - Outages may last a few days
- Minor damage to roof and siding possible

Uncertainty/Scenario


 Strongest winds and greatest potential to see the above impacts will be along the coast, including metro NYC/NJ, and southern Westchester

Earliest Reasonable Time of Arrival

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


- The earliest reasonable time of arrival of Tropical Storm Force Winds is this morning.
- Preparedness actions for high risk groups and assets should be nearly completed.

Most Likely Time of Arrival

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


- The most likely time of arrival of Tropical Storm Force Winds is early this afternoon
- All preparedness actions should be completed by this time!

Note: There will likely be locally higher amounts





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
- What's Changed?
 - Lowered total precipitation amounts
- Likely Hazards:
 - Storm Total Rainfall Forecast: I-3"
 - Locally 5", NYC and N&W
 - I to 2 inches for Eastern LI and SE CT.
- Timing- Today
 - Heaviest rain, and most widespread flood threat will likely be in a 6-8 hr. period into this evening (10am-10pm)

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Flash Flood Threat Today

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- Localized Flash Flood Today
- Scattered to Numerous Flash Flood Impacts Today (10am-10pm):
 - Urban, poor drainage Flash Flooding.
 - Minor to Moderate flooding along rapid rising stream and creeks
 - Significant rises on larger stem rivers possible.



Coastal Flood Warning in Effect for tonight

Reasonable Worst Case Storm Surge Inundation Scenario.

- Areas of Moderate coastal flooding impacts expected.
 - 2 to locally 3 ft inundation
 - Along Lower NY/NJ Harbor, Jamaica Bay, Great South Bay of W
 LI, and Southern CT and Westchester coast
- Breaking Waves This afternoon/evening
 - 10-15 ft ocean beaches
 - 4-7 ft Coastal Westchester and CT
 - 2-3 ft waves on GSB and NY Harbor
- Low and localized potential for life threatening coastal flooding (along South Shore Bay of Nassau and Queens).
 - 3+ ft inundation

Timing – Tonight's High Tide

- LI Sound I Ipm Iam
- South 9pm midnight

Uncertainty-

 If peak surge occurs before time of high tide, inundation will be less than forecast.




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




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Reasonable Worst Case Storm
Surge Inundation Areas - Shaded in Blue.


Low lying areas, that are not showing explicit inundation – Shaded in Yellow.

Areas circled in red have a moderate potential for I to 2 ft of inundation above ground level, with a low probability of 3 ft of inundation above ground level.

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
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Reasonable Worst Case Storm Surge Inundation Areas - Shaded in Blue.

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


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
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High Surf and Dangerous Rip Current

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- High Surf
 - 10-15 ft breaking surf this afternoon into evening
 - Widespread dune erosion and localized wash overs are likely for the ocean beachfront during the tonight's high tides. This may result in some flooding of roadways and vulnerable structures behind compromised dunes.
- High Risk of Rip Currents through Wednesday.
 - Worst conditions Today.


- Tropical storm conditions this morning into this evening
- Peak Wind Potential 50g65kt
 - 15-20 ft seas ocean
 - 5-10 ft LI Sound

Isolated Severe Thunderstorm Potential



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Severe Weather (Tornado Threat) - Isolated damaging wind and tornado/waterspout threat this afternoon into evening.


- A brief and isolated tornado is possible in any thunderstorm
- SPC currently has a enhanced risk with a 10% chance of a tornado for most of the area.

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✓ Confidence is HIGH that the event will occur
 ✓ Confidence is MODERATE to HIGH regarding track, intensity and impacts



Tropical Storm Force sustained winds expected, highest threat NYC/NJ metro and coast. Could see tropical storm force winds as early as this morning and likely early this afternoon.



Heavy rainfall and Flash Flood potential through tonight. Flood Watch continues for NYC, NE NJ, Lower Hudson Valley, and SW CT.



Moderate Coastal Flood and Shoreline impacts likely this evening.



High Surf Tuesday into tonight.


Dangerous Rip Currents thru Wed.
