Two vehicles were pulled out of high water, and State Highway 8 was closed due to high water. **Woodward County** 2 SW Mutual 0200CST 0800CST 20K Flash Flood A paved road was washed away. Alfalfa County 2 SE Helena 0300CST Flash Flood State Highway 45 was closed due to high water. Large amounts of runoff caused many rivers to rise above flood stage, including the Salt Fork Arkansas River at Tonkawa, the Chikaskia River near Braman and Blackwell, the Cimarron River near Waynoka, Okeene, and Dover, and the North Canadian River near Seiling. Most river flooding lasted for one to two days, with the extent of flooding considered minor. An exception was the Chikaskia River at Blackwell, which rose to 32.83 feet, which is considered major flooding. Many homes were isolated during this period.
