
November 9-10, 2002: Severe Weather



- National Overview: On November 10, 2002, a major severe weather outbreak affected a large area from the Tennessee Valley northward across the Ohio Valley to northern Ohio and Indiana. The Storm Prediction Center forecast a high risk of severe thunderstorms, including the potential for major tornadoes, for the Ohio and Tennessee Valleys that day.
- Local Effects: Deadly strong to violent tornadoes occurred over Tennessee and Ohio, but the area served by the Paducah office escaped the brunt of the severe weather. Isolated cases of structural wind damage occurred, primarily at Owensboro, KY and at Fruitland, MO near Cape Girardeau.
- Two confirmed tornadoes occurred with a supercell thunderstorm that tracked northeast across Jackson and Franklin Counties of Illinois. A storm survey by a representative of the National Weather Service determined that a weak tornado occurred near Elkville and Desoto, Illinois. The same storm later produced a second tornado just north of Royalton, IL in Franklin County. That tornado, which had a much shorter path length than the Jackson County tornado, was rated F-o and caused only tree damage.
- Below are maps, generated by the Storm Prediction Center, of severe weather reports across the country. The first map shows reports on November 9 and map two shows reports on November 10.

...STORM SURVEY CONDUCTED IN JACKSON COUNTY ILLINOIS...

THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE CONDUCTED A SURVEY OF DAMAGE THAT OCCURRED ON SUNDAY AFTERNOON IN EASTERN JACKSON COUNTY. BASED ON STORM SPOTTER REPORTS AND THE DAMAGE PATTERN...IT WAS DETERMINED THAT A WEAK TORNADO OCCURRED. THE TORNADO OCCURRED OVER SPARSELY POPULATED FARM COUNTRY AND CAUSED RELATIVELY LITTLE DAMAGE.

DATE OF STORM... NOV. 10

TIME... APPROX. 145 PM CST TO 157 PM CST

LOCATION... 3 MI NORTHWEST OF DESOTO TO 5 EAST OF ELKVILLE

TYPE OF EVENT... F-0 TORNADO

PATH LENGTH... APPROX. 9 MILES
PATH WIDTH... APPROX. 100 YARDS
PEAK WIND... ESTIMATED 70 MPH

THE DAMAGE WAS GENERALLY VERY LIGHT. SOME SHINGLES WERE BLOWN OFF A BARN NEAR THE END OF THE DAMAGE PATH. OTHER DAMAGE INCLUDED TREE TOPS BROKEN OFF AND POWER POLES BENT. LOOSE DEBRIS SUCH AS TIN AND PAPER WAS BLOWN AROUND. DAMAGE WAS ESTIMATED AT LESS THAN FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS.

Jackson County

Damage was generally very light. Some shingles were blown off a barn near the end of the damage path. Other damage included tree tops broken off and power poles bent. Loose debris such as tin and paper was blown around.

Franklin County

A weak tornado caused some tree damage as it crossed a highway just north of Royalton. The tornado was spawned by the same supercell thunderstorm that produced a longer-track tornado in Jackson County.

Cape Girardeau County

Near the intersection of Highway W and County Road 601, a trailer was demolished and blown into a building. Trees were blown down, a metal barn roof was blown off, and several homes lost shingles.
