From 4 to 6 inches of snow fell across parts of southeast Missouri, generally along and south of a line from Poplar Bluff to Dexter to central Scott County. To the north of that line, 1 to 3 inches of snow fell as far north as Marble Hill and Jackson. The snow was mixed with some sleet in all of the affected areas. Numerous vehicles slid off roadways as temperatures dropped and roads became treacherous. Specific accumulations included 6 inches in Dudley (western Stoddard County), 5 inches in Bernie (southern Stoddard County) and Charleston (Mississippi County), and 4 inches in Poplar Bluff. In the wake of an arctic cold front, very cold air invaded southeast Missouri from the north. A surface low pressure center moved northeast across Mississippi and Alabama, spreading precipitation well north into the cold air.
