






## **PRE**CIPITATION **S**UMMARY AND **T**EMPERATURE **O**BSERVATIONS FOR THE WASHINGTON, DC & BALTIMORE, MD AREA

## **MARCH 2001**

## COLDEST MARCH SINCE 1996 ACROSS THE WASHINGTON/BALTIMORE AREA



## **HIGHLIGHTS**

- Subnormal temperatures and above-normal precipitation across the Washington/Baltimore area;
- 25 days with <u>at</u> or below normal temperatures during March 2001 (only 8 such days March 2000) and a significant temperature difference (8°F cooler) this March than same time last year at DCA (see graphic);
- Coldest March at DCA, BWI and IAD since 1996;
- Monthly temperature departures of -2°F or lower recorded at all three major airports;
- First March since 1993 without a 70°F+ high at DCA;
- Eleven days with at or below freezing lows at DCA, the most such March days since 1993;
- Strong coastal storm generated over an inch of rain and wind gusts up to 50 mph on the 21st;
- Up to two inches of rain across the region on 29th-30th;
- Sixth consecutive March with above-normal precipitation at DCA, BWI & IAD:
- High winds (up to 70) mph blew through Prince William County, VA on the evening of 13th;
- January-March precipitation slightly below normal at both DCA & IAD and slightly above normal at BWI.
