...National Weather Service Raleigh, NC Transitioning to a New Format for the Area Forecast Discussion Beginning on January 12, 2026...

Beginning at 12:00 AM EST on Monday January 12, 2026, the National Weather Service Raleigh, NC Forecast Office will transition to a Key Message format for the Area Forecast Discussion (AFDRAH).

This strategic change aligns the Area Forecast Discussion (AFD) with an impacts-first message philosophy, enabling our office to streamline communication and reduce redundancy. This transition moves away from a strictly chronological layout to focus immediately on potential weather impacts and hazards. By prioritizing Key Messages, we aim to enhance clarity and eliminate duplication within the Area Forecast Discussion.
