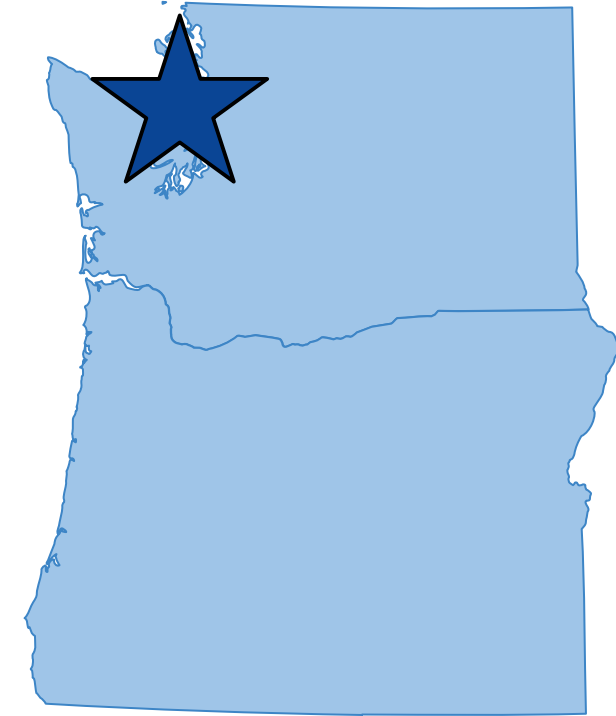


Key Forecast Messages

This outlook will be updated by 4 pm daily June 7 - July 6, 2026

1. Significantly warmer temperatures this weekend into early next week will bring increased risk of heat-related illnesses. The heat will peak Sunday through Tuesday. A 20% to 50% chance of Major HeatRisk exists across portions of the state Sunday through Tuesday, with locally higher probabilities around 80% near the Columbia River in Western Washington.
2. An elevated fire danger risk will exist early next week due to the hot, dry conditions. An increased risk for brush fires is expected into next week. Breezy east winds are expected Sunday afternoon through Monday afternoon for the western Columbia River Gorge in particular.
3. A cooling trend is expected to begin around Wednesday with a return of near-seasonal conditions into the remainder of the week. This will also result in increasing west winds, especially for eastern Washington. Fire weather concerns increase across Eastern Washington Tuesday into Wednesday as a result of dry conditions and stronger winds.
