Hot start, cold finish, but dry overall

- Near-normal temperatures, below-normal rainfall.
- Among the coldest Halloween mornings on record:
 - tied for 4th coldest Tallahassee
 - 2nd coldest Apalachicola
 - 4th coldest Valdosta
 - tied for 7th coldest Albany
 - o tied for 3rd coldest Dothan
- Only 7 days or less of measurable rain.
- Further drought degradation to severe-extreme category as of Oct 28.
- <u>EF-1 tornado</u> near Mexico Beach on Oct 27.








Worsening drought - valid October 28, 2025

- Extreme D3 Drought across the I-10 corridor and much of Southwest GA.
- Severe D2 Drought in Southeast AL and south of the I-10 corridor.
- Moderate D1 Drought mostly in the Southeast FL Big Bend.
- One to two-class degradation over the previous 4 weeks, dating back to September 30.
- Impacts: stress on vegetation, lowering water levels, agricultural hardship, drying fuels, elevated fire concerns, water shortages.

October 2025 Tropical Recap

Hurricane Melissa makes history

- Four named storms, one hurricane: Jerry, Karen, Lorenzo, Melissa.
- Jerry peaked as a tropical storm with max winds/min pressure of 65 mph/999 mb.
- Karen was a short-lived subtropical storm over the extreme North Atlantic.
- Lorenzo peaked as a tropical storm with max winds/min pressure of 60 mph/999 mb.
- Melissa peaked as a category-5 hurricane:
 - Tied 1935 Labor Day Hurricane for most intense landfalling hurricane (892 mb)
 - Tied 1935 Labor Day & Dorian 2019 for strongest landfalling hurricane (185 mph)
 - Tied 1935 Labor Day, Gilbert 1988, Dorian for 2nd strongest hurricane (1st, Allen 1980, 190 mph).
 - Tied 1935 Labor Day for 3rd most intense hurricane (1st, Wilma 2005, 882 mb; 2nd, Gilbert, 888 mb).
