

Tropical Weather Outlook

From the National Hurricane Center



- → Track nudged slightly west again
- → Rafael is still expected to be a hurricane as it passes to our west Wednesday into Thursday, with high confidence that the worst impacts will remain well offshore

Probability of TS Winds





Earliest Reasonable Arrival Time of Tropical-Storm-Force Winds













Rainfall


Current Forecast



- Rainfall totals remain the same from previous forecast
- → Additional adjustments are expected. A continued westward shift will mean less rainfall.
- → Most of this rain falls from Tuesday through Thursday



Reasonable Worst Case Rainfall Forecast




- → This forecast reflects what totals would look like with an eastward shift of the track.
- → Amounts of 3-5 inches look to be a reasonable worst case scenario.
- → Majority of this rain falls late Tuesday through Thursday.



Excessive Rainfall Outlook

Wednesday



Locations of Concern

- → Western half of the FL peninsula.
- → There is a 5-15% chance of flooding.

Timing


→ Wednesday through Thursday.





Excessive Rainfall Outlook

Thursday



Locations of Concern

- → Rafael will continue shifting away from the region.
- → Area of greatest concern for heavy rainfall will be around Tampa Bay northward.


Timing

→ Through Thursday, diminishing late in the day.





Little to No Surge Forecast




- Not expecting more than 1 to 2 ft of storm surge late Wednesday into early Thursday.

→ Far southwest Florida Coast.

Timing


→ Late Wednesday through early Thursday.





Marine Impacts

Thursday/Thursday Night



- → There is an increasing risk for impacts over our coastal waters.
- → Greatest impacts will remain well offshore.
- → Limited impacts for Tampa Bay and Charlotte Harbor.


Risk Level	Category	Definition
	None	No Marine Hazards Risk.
	Limited	Wind or Wind Gusts >= 25 knots and/or Waves >= 6 feet.
	Elevated	Wind or Wind Gusts >= 34 knots and/or Waves >= 8 feet.
	Significant	Wind or Wind Gusts >= 48 knots and/or Waves >= 10 feet.
	Extreme	Wind or Wind Gusts >= 64 knots and/or Waves >= 15 feet.





Rip Current Impacts

Late Wednesday through Friday



- → Large, breaking swells will move toward the coast starting Wednesday.
- → High risk of rip currents late Wednesday through Friday.
- → Some impacts linger into the weekend.

Heed the advice of the local beach patrol and flag warning systems.


	Level	Category	Definition
		Low	The risk of rip currents is low, however, life threatening rip currents may still occur especially near groins, jetties, reefs, and piers.
		Moderate	There is an elevated/moderate risk of hazardous/life threatening rip currents. Always swim near a lifeguard and remember to heed the advice of the local beach patrol and flag warning systems.
60		Ulah	There is a significant/high risk of hazardous/life threatening rip currents. Swimming is not recommended.





High Surf Impacts

Thursday



- → Large, breaking swells will move toward the coast starting Wednesday and continuing into Friday.
- Beach erosion likely.

Category Definition

→ Coastal flooding of 1-2 feet above MHHW possible Wednesday through early Friday.

Level		
	None	No High Surf Risk.
	Limited	Breaking waves that would result in hazardous conditions to anyone who enters the surf possible.
	Elevated	Large breaking waves that would result in dangerous swimming and surfing and/or localized beach erosion possible.
	Significant	Large breaking waves that would result in life-threatening swimming and surfing and/or significant beach erosion possible.
	Extreme	Large breaking waves that would result in life-threatening swimming and surfing and/or major beach





Summary

Primary Weather Concerns

- The forecast has shifted slightly to the west again, but no changes for land areas. If the westward shift continues, lower impacts will be realized. Either way, there is high confidence that the worst impacts will remain well offshore.
- → Coastal waters impacts continue increase, with limited impacts for Tampa Bay and Charlotte Harbor.
- → Coastal communities should expect high surf capable of causing beach erosion, rip currents, and coastal flooding of 1-2 feet Wednesday through Friday.
- → Main hazard for land will be heavy rainfall Wednesday and Thursday, but the threat decreases as the track shifts westward.
