The thunderstorms organized into a squall line as they moved into northeastern Oklahoma during the evening. The atmosphere across eastern Oklahoma became extremely unstable ahead of the thunderstorms, and supported strong downbursts. Numerous damaging wind events and isolated large hail up to quarter size occurred as these storms moved through northeastern Oklahoma.
