Thunderstorm winds gusted to 67 miles an hour at the Fort Smith Municipal Airport 4 miles southeast of Fort Smith and to 65 miles an hour in Fort Smith.

Thunderstorm winds gusted to 60 miles an hour at several other locations in northeast Oklahoma. Quarter size hail fell 3 miles east of Burbank and at Wynona, and dime size hail fell at Welch and 2 miles east of Afton.</p>

Thunderstorm winds gusted to 60 miles an hour near Leonard and in Jamesville.</p> <p>Dime to quarter size hail fell at numerous locations in the city of Tulsa, and the hail covered the ground at spots in the southern part of the city. The hail covered the ground to a depth of 4 inches at 75th and St. Louis in the southern part of the city of Tulsa. Quarter size hail also fell at Bixby, and dime to quarter size hail fell near Leonard. Nickel size hail fell 4 miles north of Natura and at Jamesville, and dime size hail fell 3 miles west northwest of Jay, at Sand Springs, and at Oneta.</p>

miles east of New Prue. Thunderstorm winds gusted to 65 miles an hour in Kiefer, to 61 miles an hour at an automated observing site 7 miles southwest of Burbank, and to 60 miles an hour in Burbank, 6 miles west of Maramec, in Pawnee, and in Mannford. Dime size hail fell on Gilcrease Road 2 miles west of Tulsa.

As the thunderstorms weakened, strong outflow winds spread north across Osage County. An automated observing site 8 miles east southeast of Foraker recorded a peak wind gust of 65 miles an hour at 0020CST. Several other gusts over 60 miles an hour occurred between 0015CST and 0025CST. The temperature warmed about 15 degrees into the mid 80s during this time and remained in the 80s for several hours.

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Severe thunderstorms moved across southeast Oklahoma during the evening of June 6th. The storms spawned 2 tornadoes, and also produced damaging winds and large hail.

The first tornado touched down briefly at 1854CST on the north side of the Army Ammunition Plant 3 miles southwest of McAlester. No damage occurred with this F0 tornado.

The second tornado touched down briefly at 2020CST 14 miles southwest of Heavener. Trees were twisted and many tree limbs were broken off, but no structural damage occurred with this F0 tornado.

Damaging straight-line winds also occurred with the storms. Siding was blown off a house 8 miles south of Wilburton, trees were blown down just west of Wilburton and 2 miles southwest of Red Oak, and large tree limbs were blown down in Wister. Thunderstorm winds gusted to 60 miles an hour in Wilburton, and numerous large trees were blown down over county roads in Wilburton. Thunderstorm winds gusted to 60 to 70 miles an hour in Weleetka and to 60 miles an hour in Canadian. Large hail also accompanied the storms. Quarter size hail fell at Scipio, and nickel size hail fell at Heavener.

Severe thunderstorms moved across eastern Oklahoma during the evening of June 18th and early morning of June 19th. The storms spawned 1 tornado, and also produced damaging winds and large hail.

The tornado touched down briefly at 2310CST 3 miles north of Owasso near the intersection of 116th Street North and Memorial. No damage occurred with this F0 tornado.

Damaging straight-line winds also occurred with the storms. Strong thunderstorm winds damaged buildings in Rentiesville, and a fireworks stand was blown over in McAlester. Strong thunderstorm winds downed trees and damaged outbuildings 9 miles northeast of Eufaula, and trees and large tree limbs were blown down in Cookson. 2.5 inch diameter tree limbs were blown down in Checotah, and an awning was blown off a vacant grocery store in Checotah. Numerous trees were blown down in Arkoma and 2 miles south of Arkoma, with one of the trees falling on a house 2 miles south of Arkoma. Large tree limbs were blown down in Panola, and shingles were blown off homes in Panola. Trees, large tree limbs, and power lines were blown down throughout all of Latimer County.

Large tree limbs were blown down in Hollow, 2 miles west of Skiatook, in Catoosa, at 51st and Harvard in the city of Tulsa, near Stone Bluff, in Haskell, in Weleetka, and in Stigler. Thunderstorm winds gusted to 80 to 90 miles an hour 5 miles north of Okemah, to 80 miles an hour in Bixby and 1 mile north of Hectorville on the Tulsa/Okmulgee County line, and to 72 miles an hour at an automated observing site 3 miles south of Webbers Falls. Thunderstorm winds gusted to 60 to 70 miles an hour at numerous other locations in eastern Oklahoma. Large hail also accompanied the storms. Quarter size hail fell at Canadian, nickel size hail fell at Vian and 4 miles west of Vian, and dime size hail fell at Bixby and at Muldrow.
