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Weather Impact Summary: A weak cold front was located in central Louisiana and across the southern portions of Mississippi/Alabama at 23z on Sunday. This feature will advance slowly southward and enter the coastal waters before stalling early Monday morning. Given the weakness in this feature, significant improvement of visibilities/ceilings are not expected and looks like several more mornings of IFR/LIFR conditions are to be expected. A stronger weather system is forecast to approach late Tuesday/Tuesday night and these features may provide conditions less supportive of very low ceilings and dense fog - although some ceiling/visibility reductions are to be expected as showers increase across the area (and possibly embedded thunderstorms as well).

As advertised, IFR/LIFR conditions are forecast to return tonight to MSY TRACON and nearby terminals (with onset sometime around midnight) when the arrival of the cold front will bring increasing northeasterly winds which will bring reduced ceilings/visibilities into the area off Lake Pontchartrain/Lake Borgne. Look for conditions to extend through the mid-morning, likely encompassing the entire TRACON with ceilings around 300 feet AGL and visibilities ranging between ½-2sm before 14z. Conditions are expected to improve 15-16z with ceilings/fog lifting. Although conditions on Tuesday morning may not be quite as impactful we are still forecasting for at least IFR conditions with similar trends with regards to improvement. The next appreciable weather system is forecast to reach the region late on Tuesday/Tuesday night, and thunderstorm initiation is possible in eastern Louisiana and within the MSY TRACON.
