June 2014

June 1: Meteorologist-In-Charge *Steve Drillette* and Forecaster/Tropical Program Leader *Justin Gibbs* attended **StormFury Hurricane Season Special Event**, sponsored by the Urban Science Initiative. StormFury promoted hurricane information, safety, and preparedness in the Mid Valley.

Forecaster Blair Scholl staffed a Hurricane Preparedness and Hurricane Guide
Distribution booth at the Boca Chica Walmart in Brownsville that coincided with the opening

day of the 2014 Hurricane Season. Hundreds of hurricane guides and preparedness materials were handed out.

June 2, 9, 16, 23 and 30: Warning Coordination Meteorologist *Barry Goldsmith* participated by e-mail, phone, or both, in the **Weekly Texas Drought Monitor Teleconference.**

June 2: *Barry Goldsmith* taped a half hour hurricane special with Edinburg Cable Network (ECN).

June 3: Forecaster/Spanish Language Team Leader *Maria Torres* provided an interview on the 2014 Hurricane Outlook to Radio Luz, 760 AM, from Tampa, FL.

- Barry Goldsmith provided an hour long session on the 2014 hurricane season forecast, "More to the Story than the Category", where to find impact graphics, and basic preparedness to the USCBP Region VI Emergency Planning Meeting in Edinburg. Approximately 40 representatives from the Rio Grande Valley and beyond were in attendance.

June 4 – 5: *Steve Drillette, Barry Goldsmith,* and volunteer *Bianca Villanueva* staffed a booth at the **2014 South Texas Hurricane Conference** at the McAllen Convention Center. Over 300 attendees stopped by the booth to discuss the upcoming hurricane season and to pick up preparedness materials.

June 5: *Barry Goldsmith* provided a one hour session titled **"The 2014 Atlantic Hurricane Season: Low Odds, High Impact?" to the South Texas Hurricane Conference**. More than 100 visitors attended the presentation.

June 6: *Barry Goldsmith* provided a 5 minute presentation on the importance of preparedness for the 2014 Hurricane Season, and staffed a booth for the **Hidalgo County Dare to Prepare** event at the **Alton CRC**. More than 30 residents attended.

June 7: *Barry Goldsmith* provided a 45 minute talk on 2013 Atlantic hurricane season's "Failure to Launch" and the 2014 Forecast to 13 residents of Laguna Vista at the Laguna Vista Town Meeting on Hurricane Preparedness.
