Despite little to no rainfall from the second full week of July to the end of the month, impacts from the heavy rains of late June and early July manifest themselves in continued improvement in drought conditions across all of Deep South Texas and the Rio Grande Valley from mid July the month's end. While a month earlier, all areas were in Extreme (D3) to Exceptional (D4) Drought, by July 12th, only the northern tier of the Deep South Country Brush Country/King Ranch and portions of the Upper Rio Grande Valley were in Extreme Drought; the Lower and Mid Valley had dropped to the Moderate and Severe (D1 and D2) categories.
